Shelly Gladden/Oklahoma ABLE Tech/OSU

ABLE Tech is the States ATF Program (Assistant Technology). It is a federally mandated program for all states. ABLE Tech helps individuals with getting access to an acquisition of assisted technology.

- Library of over 500 devices that cover all assistive technologies covering all disabilities.
- Device Demonstration Help to find solutions for caregivers to make caregiving easier and for the person with the disease to be more successful at daily task and to help caregivers with issues they may have.
- Device Loan at no cost for 6 weeks to see if the device is for them before purchasing.
- Device Reutilization In partnership with The Oklahoma Health Care Authority, they take in
 donated devices or medical equipment, repair it and give it to Oklahomans are in need at no
 cost. They have an exchange program where individuals can list equipment they may have or
 donate it to ABLE.

Financial Loans - Loan program in Partnership with BancFirst of Stillwater and the Oklahoma
Assistive Technology Association, to help individuals purchase assistive technology equipment
such as hearing aids and modified vehicles to top the list. The loans have a 5% interest rate and
special programs for individuals with limited income or poor credit.

 another respite provider to temporarily care for loved ones. Eligibility for care givers: Is 18 years
 or older, full-time unpaid, Is a grandparent or other relative age 54 or younger raising a child, no
 household income, Does not receive respite services or payments for other programs including
 but not limited to foster care, Family Support Assistance Payment, OAA Title III-E, ODMHSAS
 Systems of Care Funding.
- Oklahoma Caregiver Coalition Over 160 partners statewide, 9 subcommittees established after statewide needs assessment, and Quarterly meetings held virtually.
