Marburg virus disease (MVD)

is a rare but often deadly disease.

How Marburg can spread in Humans

- Contact with an infected animal.
- Direct contact with body fluids of someone sick with or who has died from MVD.
- Direct contact with something that has touched the body fluids of someone who is sick with or has died from MVD.

SYMPTOMS

Symptoms can appear two to 21 days after MVD exposure, and often include:

- Fever
- Aches and pains including headache
- Sore throat
- Weakness

About 5 days after symptoms start a blister like rash appears on chest, stomach and back. This is followed by diarrhea, nausea, vomiting, jaundice and severe weight loss. delirium, liver failure, pancreatitis, and major internal and external bleeding.

TRAVEL



MVD is not common in the United States. People in the U.S. usually get it through travel to other countries experiencing an outbreak.

If you have traveled outside of the U.S. in the past 21 days and have any of these symptoms, tell your doctor, nurse or medical provider right away.
