PHE Unwinding

During an unprecedented national public health emergency, OHCA's TGR team has collaborated with ITUs to ensure regular and timely updates are provided. In addition, OHCA cobranded with tribal partners on communication to tribal communities about the unwinding of the PHE. The TGR team was highlighted as a best-practice by CMS for our data sharing efforts with ITUs to assist their direct outreach.



ITU Shared Savings

In 2021, Senate Bill 434 Tribal Shared Savings was passed and promulgated into state law. The legislation supported an initiative that began with tribal partners with the goals of increasing care coordination for Al/AN SoonerCare members and leveraging the 100% FMAP to save state dollars. A full year of the program has realized these goals, and the efforts are underway to further increase savings.

SoonerCare Tribal Consultation Annual Meeting

Oklahoma Health Care Authority (OHCA) and Southern Plains Tribal Health Board (SPTHB) partner each year to host SoonerCare Tribal Consultation Annual Meeting (TCAM) which encourages open dialogue, meaningful discussions, collaboration opportunities, and to achieve common goals.

Bi-Monthly Tribal Consultation

OHCA convenes Bi-Monthly Tribal Consultation Meetings (BMTC) on the first Tuesday of every odd numbered month. BMTC is a formal process to consider items including but not limited to policy, waivers, procedures, legislative mandates and budgets. The goal is to determine impact and opportunities for collaboration with tribal partners.



About Pathways

Money Follows the Person (MFP) transitions qualified Oklahomans from a nursing home back into the community of their choice. MFP Tribal Initiative (Pathways) was modified to work more independently with tribes to give funds more specific to their needs.
