<u>Effective 2/15/2007</u> - Glumetza[®] 500mg tablets, Fortamet[®] 500mg and 1000mg Tablets will require Prior Authorization.

The Drug Utilization Review Board recommends prior authorization of Fortamet[®] and Glumetza[®] with approval to be based on clinical documentation of inability to take other forms of generic metformin ER.

Effective 2/15/2007 – Exubera® Inhaled Insulin will require Prior Authorization

Criteria:

- 1. A quantity limit based on the manufacturer's packaging per 30 days.
- 2. Members must be 18 years of age or older.

Type II Diabetics:

- 1. Inability to maintain HbA1c levels at or below 7% after a minimum of six months on two oral agents, and
 - 2. Diagnosis of injection-phobia, provided no additional injectable medications (including other forms of insulin) are being utilized.

 \underline{Or}

3. Member currently using injectable insulin and experiencing severe persistent problems with injection sites, such as lipohypertrophy.

Type I Diabetics:

1. Currently using injectable insulin and experiencing severe persistent problems with injection sites, such as lipohypertrophy. (Exubera® is not approved as monotherapy in type I diabetics.)

For both types:

Patients must not be smokers or have discontinued smoking in the past 6 months, or have unstable or poorly controlled lung disease (asthma, COPD, etc). Pulmonary function must be assessed prior to initiating therapy.

Approval for 6 months with a follow up HbA1c. If HbA1c has not decreased by a minimum of 1% or if not at or below 7%, further renewal will not be granted without supporting information for continued use of the product.

All members who are approved for Exubera® will be enrolled in the Diabetes Disease Management Program, if not already participating.

<u>Effective 5/23/2007</u> - All pharmacy claims submitted to SoonerCare must identify the prescriber by their National Provider Identifier (NPI) number. A default prescriber number will be made available for use in special circumstances. More information on this subject will be included in future Pharmacy Updates.
