**MONTHLY INVESTMENT
PERFORMANCE REPORT**

SEPTEMBER 2006

November 30, 2006

To the People of Oklahoma:

I am pleased to issue the September monthly investment performance report for the Office of the State Treasurer. I trust you will find it thorough and in keeping with my commitment to provide full disclosure of all activities within my office. As always, my staff is available to answer any questions you might have.

Market Conditions

Yields on U.S. Treasuries moved lower across the curve on September. The 10-year Treasury note was lower by 10 basis points at month-end with a yield of 4.63%. The yield curve continues to be inverted with the 6-month point the high, a low in the 5-year area and gradually rising out to 30 years. With the short-term interest rate target at 5.25% the 2-year Treasury is 52 basis points below the target. In the markets, the Dow Jones Industrial Average closed the month at 11,697, within 0.4% of its record close of 11,722 on January 14, 2000. For the July-to-September period the Dow gained 4.7%, its biggest gain since a 5.1% advance in 1995. The S&P 500 added 1.6% to extend its third quarter gain to 5.2%, its best quarterly performance since 2004 and its biggest rise in the July-to-September period since 1997. The Nasdaq gained 1.8% to 2,258, bringing its third quarter advance to 4%. As expected, the Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC) kept the short-term interest rate target at 5.25% for a second consecutive meeting. Expressing concern about inflation the Committee stated that if it changes rates soon, it is more likely to raise them than lower them.

Economic Developments

The Institute for Supply Management index for August was 54.5 compared with 54.7 the previous month. The unemployment rate fell to 4.7% in August from 4.8% in July. The core producer price index (PPI) fell -0.4% with the year-over-year rate dropping sharply from 1.3% to 0.9%. The headline PPI was 0.1%. August retail sales rose 0.2%. The consumer price index (CPI) increase was 0.2% in August from July. A continuing rise in rents is a main area of concern. Over the past six months, tenants' rent and owners' equivalent rent have risen at annualized rates of 4.4% and 5% respectively. The U.S. trade deficit hit a record \$68.04 billion in July, a 5% increase from June and the gap's sharpest widening in nearly a year. The increase in summer oil prices contributed to the increase. The Conference Board's consumer confidence index was better than expected at 104.5 for September. Falling fuel prices and an easing of threatening condition in the Middle East contributed to the increase in the index. Housing starts fell 6% in August to the lowest level in three years. Existing home sales were a bit higher than expected at 6.3 million. The Commerce Department reported purchases of new homes jumped 4.1% in August to an annual pace of 1.05 million.

Portfolio Commentary: Performance, Diversification, and Strategy

Yield on the Treasurer's portfolio was 4.76% in September; an increase of 13 basis points over August and the weighted average maturity was 345 days. The portfolio's shorter maturity helps lessen price sensitivity and allows flexibility to purchase longer-dated instruments in the future, should market opportunities be presented. A decrease in Overnight Repurchase Agreements and U.S. Treasuries was offset by an increase in U.S. government agencies and instrumentalities. August sales tax collections came in more than \$10 million above the same month last year driving the year-to-date monthly average investable base to a new high of \$3.34 billion. Portfolio diversification continues to be sound. U.S. Treasuries composed 14% of holdings, and U.S. government agencies and instrumentalities accounted for approximately 49%. Certificates of Deposit represented 7% of assets, money market mutual funds 9%, and 16% was maintained in overnight repurchase agreements. Link deposits (at less than 1%) and State bond issues (at 3%) made up the balance of funds invested. In keeping with the State's statutory investment objectives, the portfolio strategy continues to seek safety, liquidity, and return on investment, in that order. Based on market conditions, portfolio strategy will consist of a combination of laddered maturities and market observation for investment opportunities.

Collateralization

All funds under the control of this office requiring collateralization were so secured at rates ranging from 102% to 110%, depending on the type of investment.

Payments, Fees, and Commissions

All securities were purchased or sold on a net basis utilizing competitive bidding where practicable, with no additional fees or commissions known to the State Treasurer. Bank fees, mutual fund operating expenses and fees charged by JPMorgan Chase for the Tri-Party Repurchase Agreement Program are detailed in the attached pages, as is the earnings split between the Treasurer and the master custodian bank on securities lending income.



In February 2007, the Treasurer estimated earnings to the Board of Equalization for Fiscal Year 2007. The amount estimated was \$111,000,000. Year-to-date actual earnings are recorded on a cash basis of accounting.

Explanation of Performance Comparison September 30, 2006

The following page presents market rates of return on the Securities portion of the General Account and of the State's aggregated State Agency Accounts. The figures, which are dollar- and time-weighted, where appropriate, are calculated using the percentage change in market value (inclusive of accrued income) from the end of the prior month to the end of the reporting month. To ensure the integrity of the data, this information is provided by the Treasurer's custodian bank acting in its capacity as an external third party. As such, performance measurement is presently confined to those investments which are custodied at Northern Trust ("Northern").

The Treasurer's office is trying to develop a method to report rates of return on all investment instruments in the State's portfolio. This is in an effort to report return data in a manner recommended on September 15, 1994, by the Working Group of the Cash Management and Investment Oversight Commission. However, there are technical and conceptual challenges to expanding performance measurement to other portions of the portfolio. Attempting to apply market-base pricing calculations to instruments which do not trade, such as Certificates of Deposit, presents difficulty which is both conceptual and technical in nature.



The State Treasurer participates in a Securities Lending Program with The Northern Trust Company ("Northern") acting as lending agent. Northern retains 25% of the revenues generated as compensation for services. Its share for the month was \$24,634.21. Pursuant to Oklahoma State Statute Title 62 Section 90, the State Treasurer retains the first \$425,000 of securities lending revenues in a revolving fund. These funds are used to pay custody and other banking fees. Any revenue not needed for this purpose is deposited to the General Fund.
