OKLAHOMA EMPLOYMENT REPORT – May 2022

Oklahoma's unemployment rate moves up in May

Oklahoma's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate moved up to 2.8 percent in May, while the U.S. unemployment rate remained unchanged at 3.6 percent in May. Over the year, the state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 1.6 percentage points lower than May 2021.

In May, statewide seasonally adjusted employment increased by 5,860 persons (0.3 percent), while unemployment increased by 941 persons (1.8 percent). Over the year, seasonally adjusted unemployment decreased by 29,610 persons (-36.3 percent).

Oklahoma nonfarm employment adds jobs in May

Oklahoma's seasonally adjusted **NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** grew by 3,700 jobs (0.2 percent) in May 2022. U.S. seasonally adjusted **NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** rose by 390,000 jobs (0.3 percent), in May. Over the year, statewide **NONFARM EMPLOYMENT** added a seasonally adjusted 40,200 jobs (2.5 percent).

- In May, seven of Oklahoma's supersectors added jobs as **Leisure and Hospitality** (1,100 jobs) posted the largest monthly gain followed by **Education and Health Services** (900 jobs).
- Trade, Transportation and Utilities (-500 jobs) followed by Government (-300 jobs) posted the largest over-the-month job losses in May.
- Eight of Oklahoma's supersectors reported job gains over the year in May as **Trade**, **Transportation** and **Utilities** (10,600 jobs) reported the largest gain, followed by **Leisure and Hospitality** (8,400 jobs).
- Sectors showing declines in jobs over the year were **Education and Health Services** (-2,100 jobs) followed by **Information** (-600 jobs).
