House Bill 1804, became law in November, 2007, requires that all applicants for an original license must provide proof of lawful presence in the United States prior to receiving a professional license. Therefore, you are required by law to complete and have notarized the attached affidavit, and to provide supporting documentation from list A or B & C to this office. U.S. Citizens providing a notarized affidavit and appropriate documentation will only be required to submit this documentation once; legal residents of foreign nationality will be required to submit documentation each time their visa expires. A notary is available in this office Monday – Friday from 8:30am - 4:30pm.

The <u>original notarized affidavit and **photocopy** of your documentation</u> must be submitted with your online application.

Your license application will not be processed until these documents are received. If you have any questions, please contact the Board office.
