Comprehensive Review of Administrative Rules as of July 31, 2020

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Method Used to Conduct Review: Because we are not a regulatory agency, Title 515 of the Oklahoma Administrative Code largely sets out self-regulating procedures for the Pardon and Parole Board to process pardons, paroles, and commutations. For the purposes of this report, staff reviewed the code for procedures that are redundant, outdated, or unnecessary to the extent that they create unnecessary financial costs or inefficiencies for the agency.
