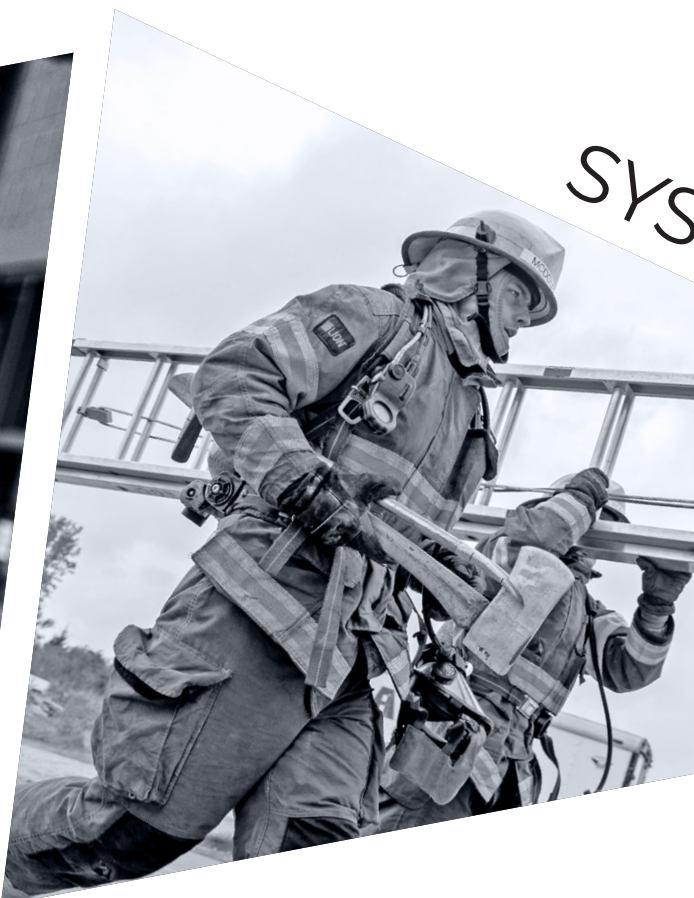

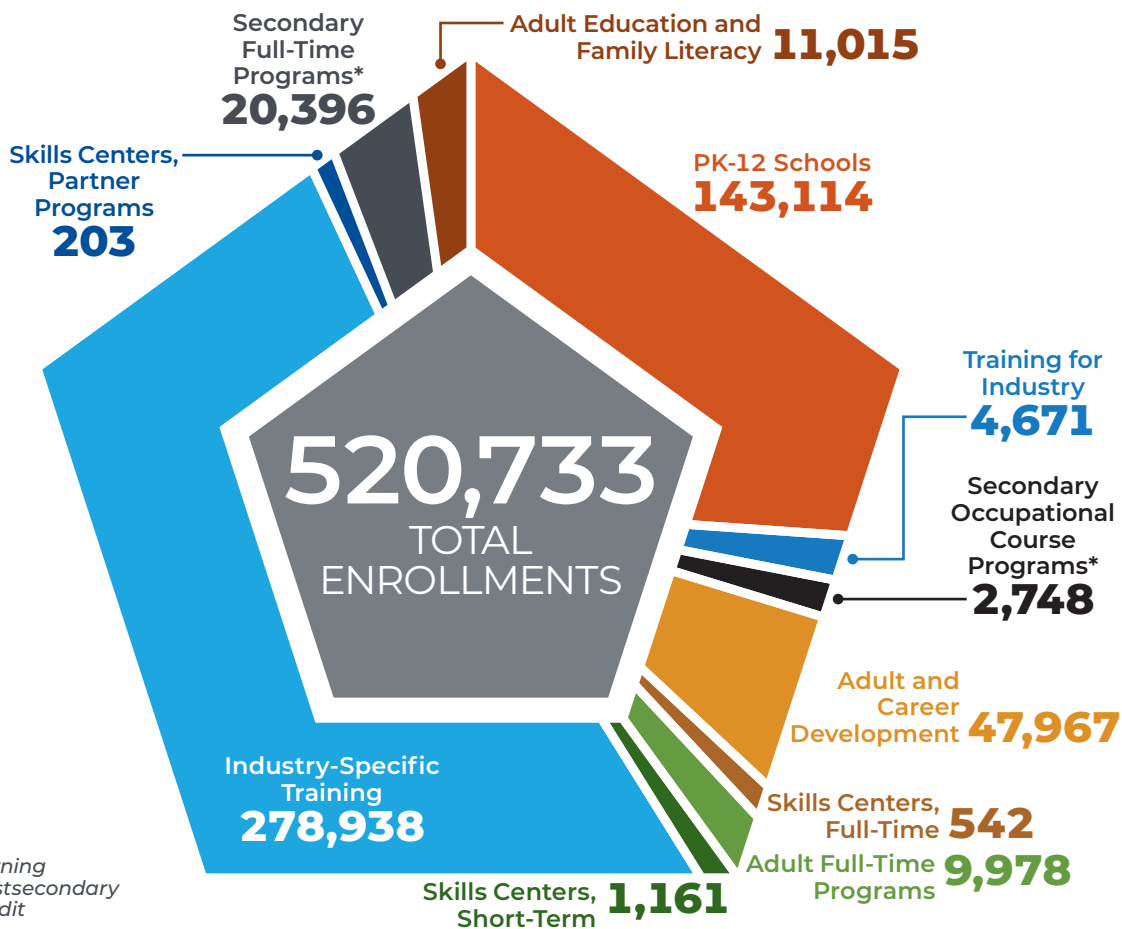

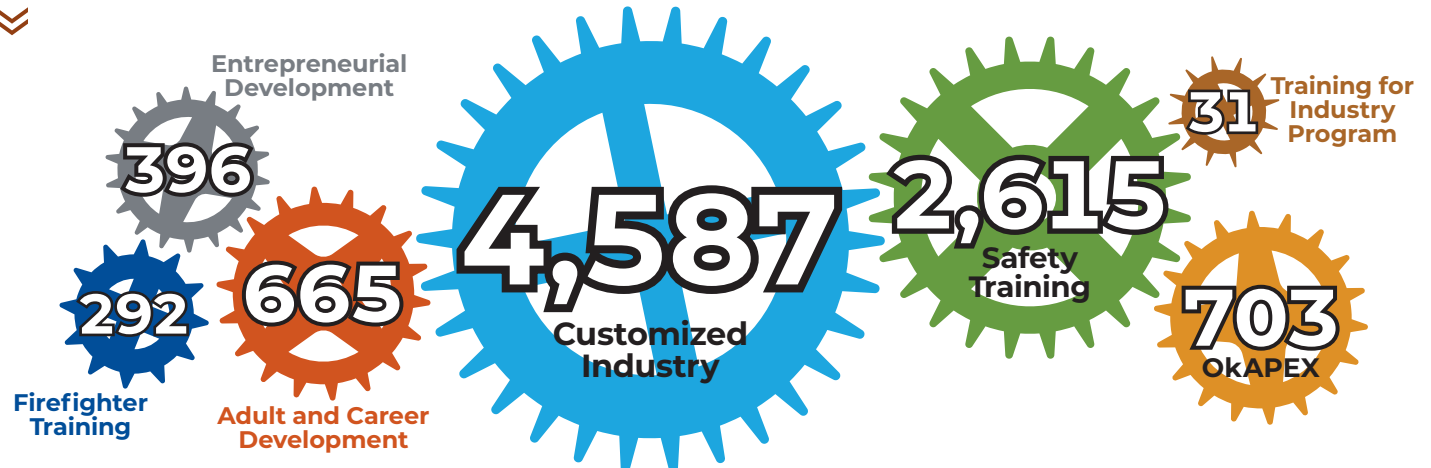

CareerTech's dropout recovery program helps students who drop out of high school earn their diplomas and gain skills to enter the workforce.



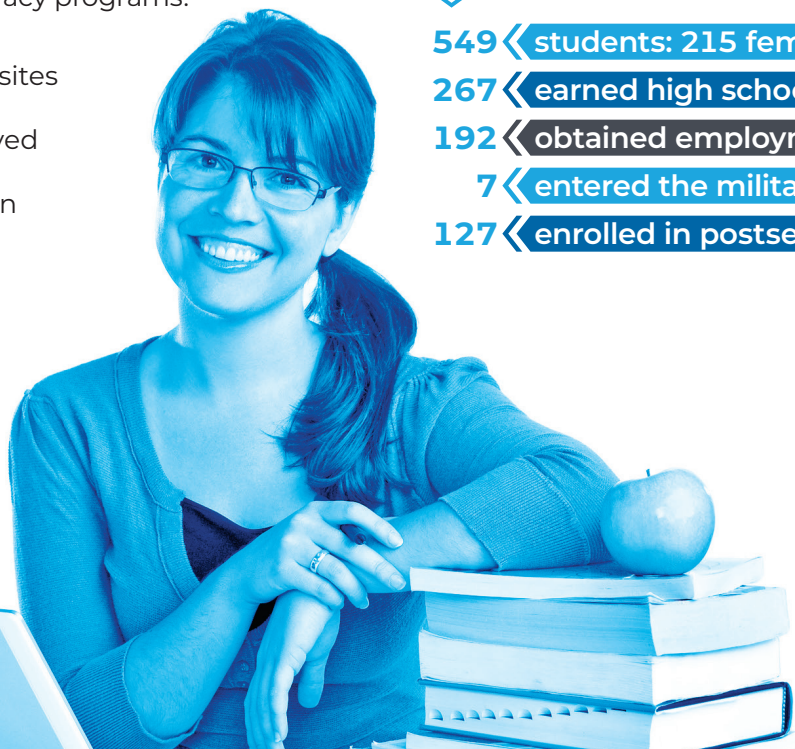

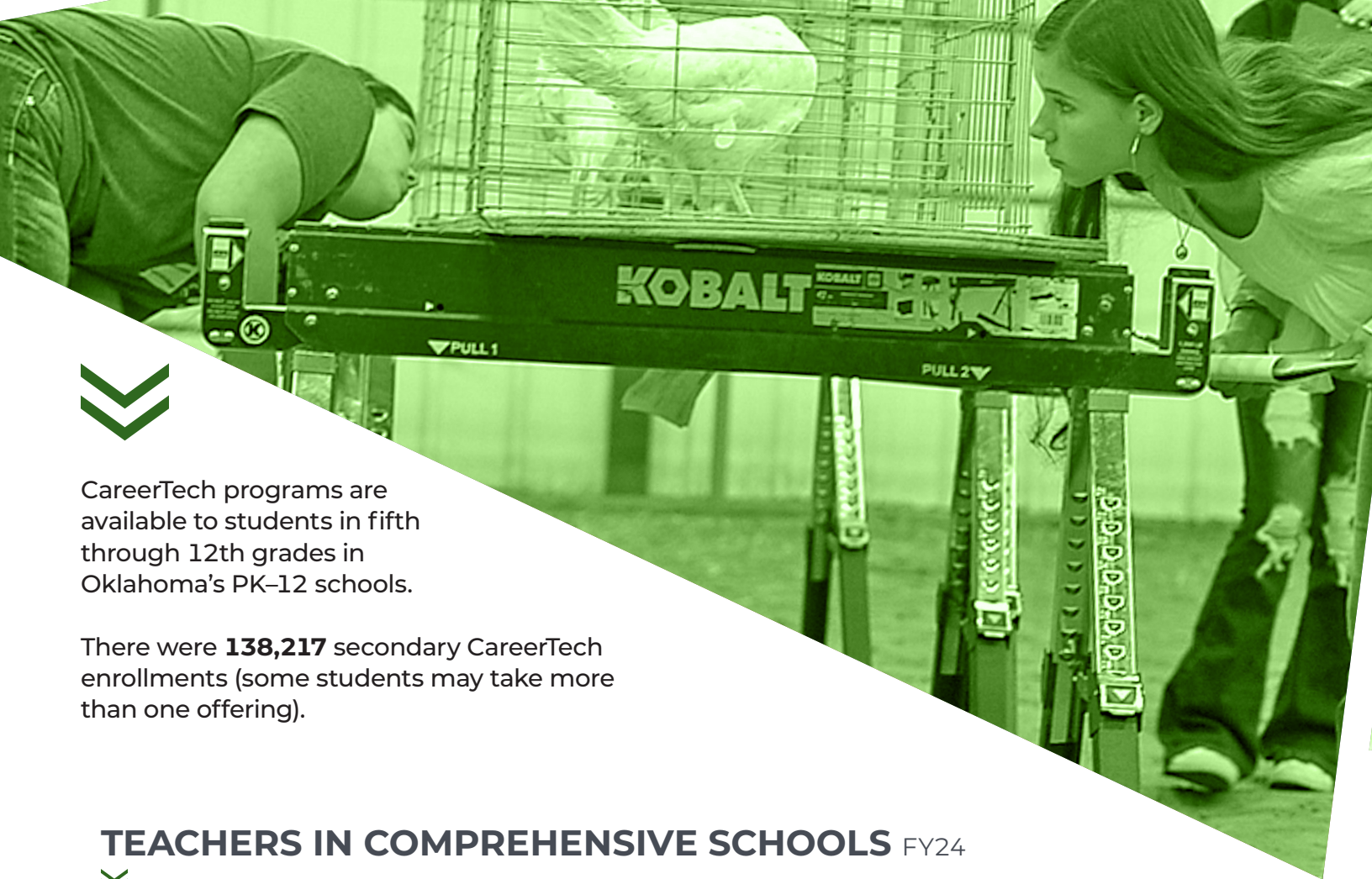

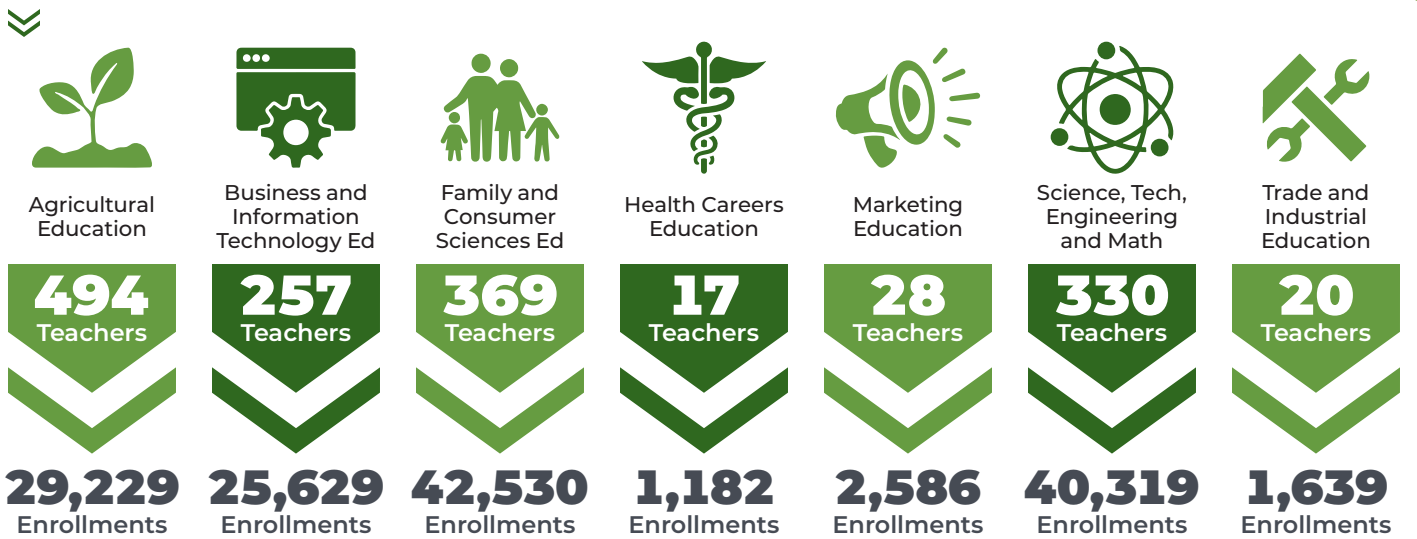
PK-12 SCHOOLS FY24 »

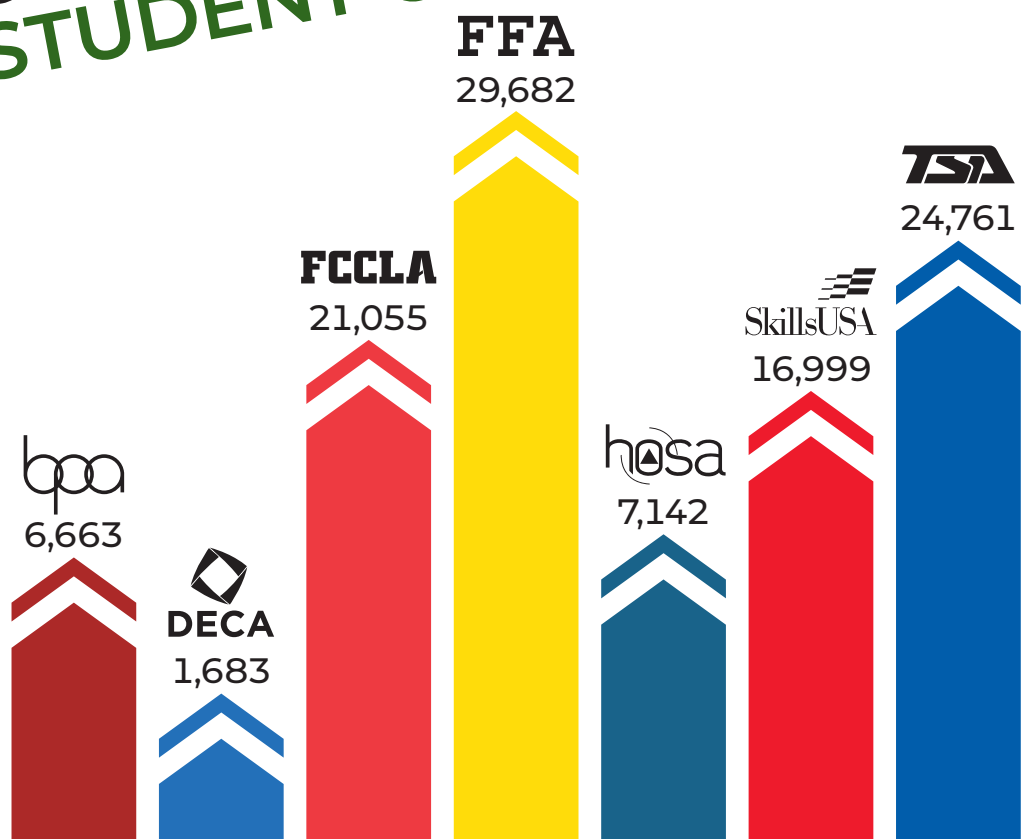

TECHNOLOGY CENTERS FY24 >>



In FY24, technology center districts operated on **62** campuses across the state, making CareerTech training and services accessible to most Oklahomans.

High school student enrollments in technology centers totaled **23,144**. Adult enrollments in career programs, industry-specific training, adult and career development and the Training for Industry Program were **341,554**.

Oklahoma CareerTech annual enrollments totaled **520,733** in FY24.

Thirty-four percent (138,217) of Oklahoma fifth–12th grade students were enrolled in CareerTech classes.

Forty-five percent (92,807) of Oklahoma ninth–12th grade students were enrolled in CareerTech classes.

More than **107,900** students learned important leadership skills as members of co-curricular CareerTech student organizations.

Oklahoma CareerTech helped more than **7,700** businesses increase sales, improve productivity, reduce costs and expand operations.

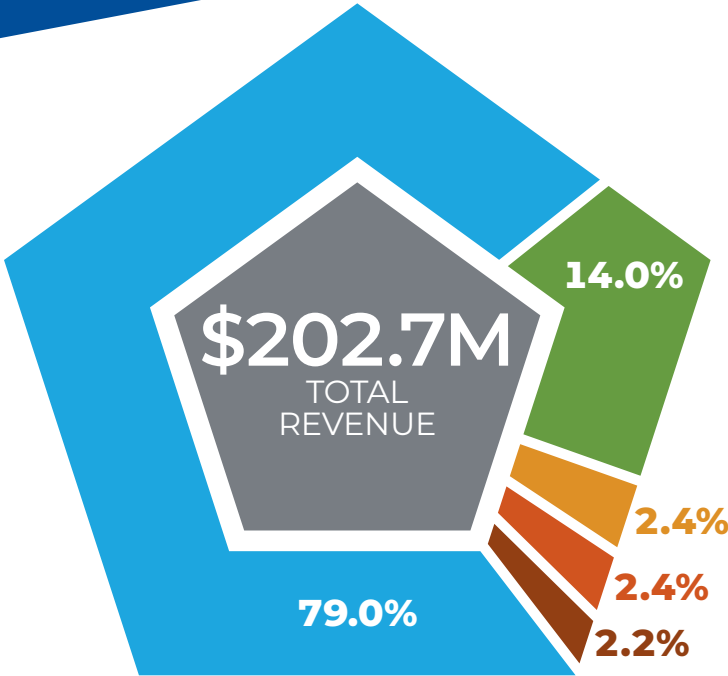
Through **1,350** program completions, Oklahoma CareerTech skills centers offered specialized training to adult and juvenile offenders.

Oklahoma CareerTech students earned **21,899** industry-endorsed certificates in FY23.

Oklahoma CareerTech programs had a **94%** positive placement rate in FY23, which means nearly all CareerTech graduates found employment, entered the military or continued their education.



ODCTE FISCAL OVERVIEW FY24 »



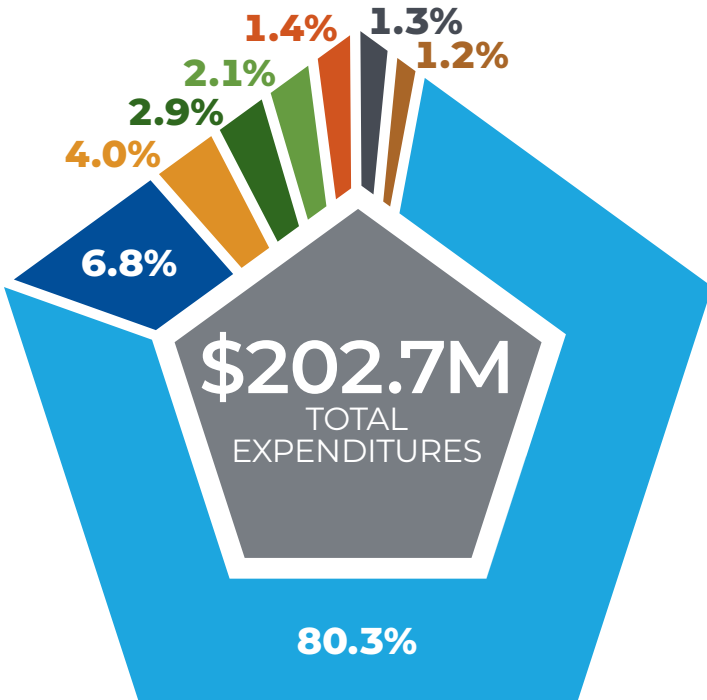

Expenditures by Activity from All Funding Sources (FY24 Actual)



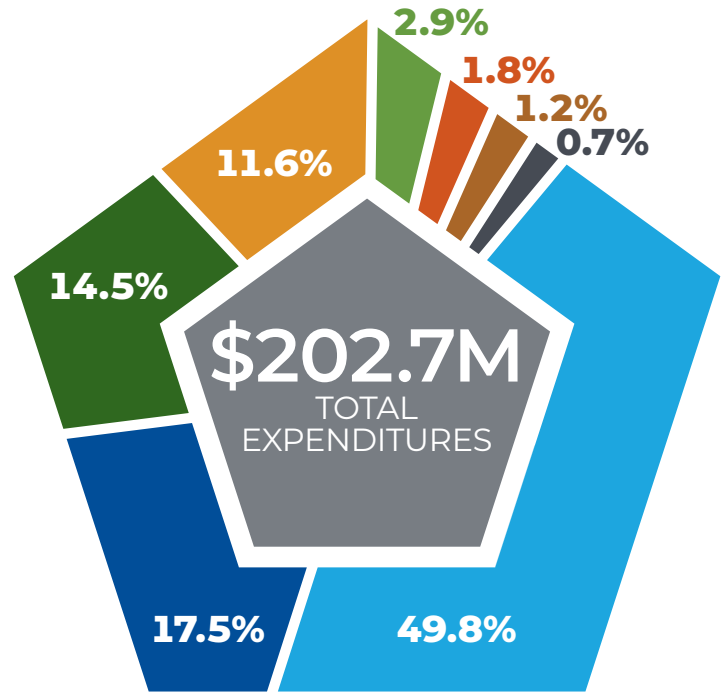

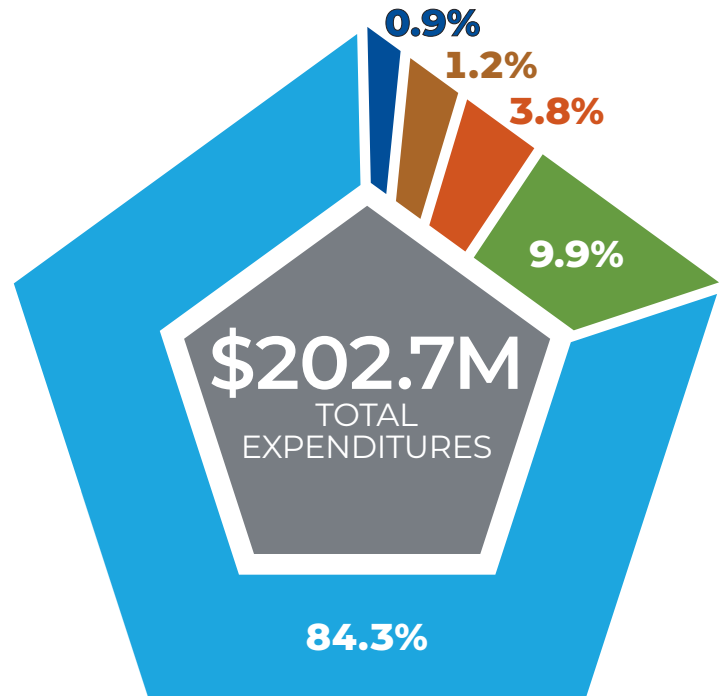
