Name	5052 - Criminal Justice I
Description	This course is designed to prepare students to enter the fields of law enforcement and the criminal justice system. Instruction includes the history of law enforcement and the legal system, report writing and recordkeeping, criminal investigation techniques, and routine police procedures. Students learn how to use communications and dispatch equipment, perform proper search and seizure techniques, conduct basic criminal investigations, and execute correct pursuit and arrest procedures. Instruction also includes patrolling techniques, private security operations, traffic investigations, and community relations. Criminal Justice I is a foundation course open to students in grades 11 and 12, some schools also offer Criminal Justice II. Major course topics include: History of Criminal Justice, Criminal Law & Procedures, Communications, Legal Responsibilities and Ethics, Basic Police Procedures, Basic Police Equipment.
