


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

FAFSA Facts

- Used to determine student eligibility for federal and state student aid
 - Grants
 - Work-study program
 - Student loans
 - Parent loans



2026–27 FAFSA® Form Now Available!

Use the *Free Application for Federal Student Aid* (FAFSA®) form to apply for financial aid for college, career school, or graduate school.

- Often requested for scholarships
- Now required for high school graduation in Oklahoma

Why FAFSA Matters

- Immediate match with Social Security Administration. Users may create account and complete FAFSA during same session
- Reduced required fields from 23 to 12, including removal of challenge questions
- Moved most critical questions to the beginning
- Immediate verification of email address and phone number (cannot create account without access to personal email)




Changes to 2026-27 StudentAid.gov Account

- Invite parent contributor with email address only
- Removed onboarding videos at beginning of application
- Changed wording from Sign student section to **Finish student section**
- Emphasizes parents still need to complete section
- Changed wording to **Finish parent section and submit**


2025-26 FAFSA Completion Results

State Profile: Oklahoma


Through **January 30, 2026**, **32.7%** of the **high school class of 2026** in Oklahoma has completed a FAFSA.

There have been **16,983** completions in Oklahoma, a **42.5% change (5,068 completions)** compared to last FAFSA cycle through the same date.








- Difficulty getting parents to events
- Other events overshadow FAFSA night
- Issues requiring assistance from FSA
 - Account creation problems
 - New phone numbers match other accounts (this has been addressed)
- Confusion over FAFSA steps
- Hard to keep track of FAFSA completion
- Students complete their section, but parents don't
- Students choose opt-out before trying FAFSA



FAFSA Event Success



- **Change the format**
 - Jenks HS – Offered drop-in individual assistance to students and families during FAFSA days (1 pm to 7 pm) – partnered with OCAP, Tulsa Higher Education Consortium and nearby colleges
- **Schedule during the school day (*while other classes test*)**
 - Porum HS – Held a mandatory senior workday (*after Fall concurrent classes ended and before holidays*). Worked on ICAP, Oklahoma’s Promise applications, and FAFSA
 - Enid HS and Edison HS– Hosted a senior resource day - FAFSA workshop included as one session
 - Santa Fe South – Gave FAFSA presentations during a tutorial hour
- **Offer alternate sessions**
 - Chandler HS – Scheduled drop-in help during school hours and in evening
 - Putnam City North HS – Scheduled multiple FAFSA events
 - Carnegie HS – Worked with seniors during a mid-day session and followed up with parents at a financial aid night two weeks later

- **Combine with other events**

- Elk City HS - Held FAFSA night alongside a mini-college fair
- Laverne HS – Held FAFSA presentation/workshop on conference night

- **Make it a celebration!**

- Ripley HS – Combined FAFSA event with College Application Week. Parents decorate tables for seniors with college gear and complete FAFSA before ceremony.
- John Marshall HS – Partnered with OCAP and Gear UP to assist families. Served Raising Cane’s. Took pictures of students who completed FAFSA and gave stickers

- **Advertise and REMIND!**

- Boise City HS – Scheduled FAFSA night in computer lab. Reminded students online, on social media, via phone, and flyers
- Elk City HS - Advertised FAFSA Night with announcement of new graduation requirement

Here's what to know:

- This event is the perfect opportunity to learn about FAFSA & complete it in one session.
- Seniors & parents should both attend to ensure everything gets finished.
- Bring a laptop if possible. (We will be in the computer lab so you may use ours!)
- Have access to your 2024 tax information, current bank account balances, and W-2 forms (especially for students who worked but didn't file taxes).
- Each attendee will need their own email address – one for the student (non-school email) & one for the parent/contributor.
- Be ready to access your email & phone that night to receive verification codes.

Don't miss this chance to get personalized help & check the FAFSA off your to-do list!

• Choose time and location for FAFSA events that works for your school

- Consider scheduling event when FSA offices are open
- Schedule at same time as mandatory senior/parent meetings

• Advertise event as place to learn and complete FAFSA

- Send details of items to bring, including phones, email addresses, taxes
- REMIND! REMIND! REMIND!

• Get help! Partner with someone familiar with FAFSA


- College financial aid office, UCanGo2 representative, other community resources
- Apply for a grant for food, giveaways, etc.

• Engage families and students

- Offer incentives like snacks, prizes, class credit, etc.
- Make it mandatory – class assignment to attend session
- Combine FAFSA event with other college prep/school events

EVENT PLANNING CHECKLIST

Whether it's a financial aid event, parent night or college fair, there are several things you can do to encourage student and parent participation when planning a college access event. Visit the second page for ideas specific to different types of events! Host these as stand-alone nights or consider combining a few or coordinating with Parent/Teacher Conferences or other events that will already be bringing families to campus.

LOGISTICS: NAIL IT DOWN

- Set the date.** Before you choose your date, think about the ages of students and families who will attend. Avoid potential conflicts with sporting events, concerts and other community events. It's best to avoid the day before and after a holiday, as well as Mondays and Fridays. Also, if you want parent participation, opt for evenings or weekends.
- Expand your team.** Partner with other organizations or sponsors who share your goals and can provide support. They may be able to contribute money, volunteers or in-kind donations like refreshments. Consider listing them as a sponsor in your promotional materials or allowing them to distribute freebies or brochures at your event. Ask your teachers if they'd be willing to offer a few extra points to students who attend and bring back a signed brochure or handout from the event.
- Gather giveaways or prizes.** Consider providing coupons to a local restaurant, tickets to school sporting events or other small freebies to encourage students and families to attend!

PROMOTION: GET THE WORD OUT

- Create promotional materials.** Print posters and flyers to hang in the halls or send home with students.
- Promote early and often.** Send save-the-date notices, post bulletin board flyers, distribute flyers and advertise on the school's website. Share reminders through social media, email blasts, mobile apps, etc. Have students chalk the sidewalks!
- Feed them.** Providing a meal or refreshments is a great way to encourage attendance and make your participants feel valued.

PLANNING CONTENT AND DELIVERY: GET READY

- Ask for help.** Ask local campuses for volunteers. Many teachers and professors require (or offer extra credit for) community service, and your event may serve as the perfect volunteer opportunity. Consider offering childcare for families with younger siblings.
- Ask the experts.** Find presenters who offer free, relevant services. Contact colleges and universities to invite financial aid counselors to talk about the financial aid process. Oklahoma Money Matters and UCanGo2 will customize their presentations to fit your organization's individual needs. - Prepare an agenda or schedule.** To keep everything running smoothly, you'll need to know in advance how everything will fit together. Prepare an agenda and share it with everyone who will be participating in the event. Print extra copies for volunteers who will be helping out that day.
- Provide take-aways.** If you have informative materials or freebies, prepare them for the event. Make sure you give participants your contact information so they can reach you if they have questions later. Be sure online evaluation links or paper forms are available if you choose to use them.

FOLLOW UP

- Review and reflect.** Plan a meeting with your team to discuss the event. Did you stay on budget? Should you have done something differently? Compile a list of recommendations to use as a reference for future events. If it's appropriate, consider asking volunteers and participants to complete an evaluation or comment card.

OKLAHOMA'S PROMISE

- Remember students can apply in 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th or before December 31 of 12th grade so make sure you invite middle school parents.
- Your event might just be informational, sharing details of the program and how to apply.
- If you want families to complete the application, consider hosting the event in a computer lab or have access to laptops.
- Download flyers from the Oklahoma's Promise website to email ahead of time or print to hand out.
- Have the [Oklahoma's Promise FAQ](#) page handy to answer common questions.

Can't host a whole event? Consider setting up a table at an athletic or other school event when families will be on campus to promote Oklahoma's Promise, FAFSA completion, concurrent enrollment or other topics.






Brainstorm FAFSA event ideas in small groups


