

Cooperative Agreement Program:


A Cooperative agreement is an arrangement an institution enters for receipt of courses or programs or portions of courses or programs delivered by another institution, service provider or entity

Course Transferable from Technology Centers:

Students who successfully complete Oklahoma Technology Center course and/or programs listed in the Statewide Technical Course Articulation Matrix may earn college transfer credit in only those technical courses approved.

Students must achieve the minimum passing grade, provide an official technology center transcript and be admitted to the participating State System institution in order to receive credit.





Technical Assessment Inventory:


