

## Concurrent Enrollment



Want to try out college before leaving high school? Consider signing up for concurrent enrollment. If you're in 11th or 12th grade, you may be eligible to take credit bearing college courses while still in high school. Visit the Admission Requirements page to find out what you need to become a concurrent student. After that, head to the Course Placement page to see the scores required for enrolling in specific classes.

High school seniors who meet the eligibility requirements are entitled to receive tuition waivers for up to 18 credit hours and high school juniors can receive tuition waivers up to 9 credit hours, subject to available funding.

11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> graders receive **free tuition** to earn college credit while still in high school.

# Concurrent Enrollment

**Early College High School** programs require an agreement between a high school and a college. Students in these programs may begin taking college classes as early as 9<sup>th</sup> grade and are designed for students to **earn a certificate or associate degree while in high school.**





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- Students may apply in the 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup> grade or 12<sup>th</sup> grade no later than 12/31 of the senior year.
- Students in the 8<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup> grades are encouraged to apply by June 30, 2026.
- Parents' Federal Adjusted Gross Income does not exceed:
  - \$60,000 with 1 or 2 dependent children
  - \$70,000 with 3 or 4 dependent children
  - \$80,000 with 5 or more dependent children  
(second income limit of \$100,000 when student starts college/career tech)
- Special accommodations for students in foster care, etc.

# New Teacher Eligibility Track

- Special income provisions may apply to children of certified public classroom teachers employed in Oklahoma for a minimum of 10 years.

# Oklahoma's Promise Pathways

- If a student enrolled in Oklahoma's Promise graduates on the **Core High School Curriculum Pathway**, they can receive Oklahoma's Promise at **Career Tech ONLY**. If they transfer to a college later, the scholarship will not follow them.
- If a student graduates with the **College Prep/Work Ready Pathway**, they can receive Oklahoma's Promise at **Career Tech or college** and the scholarship will transfer between the two.
- 15 unit curriculum aligns with college admission

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
- Once postsecondary education begins, students can receive Oklahoma's Promise for **five years**, until they receive a bachelor's degree, or until the scholarship has paid tuition for 129 credit hours, whichever comes first.
- Pays **full tuition at public college**, a portion of tuition at a private college, or a portion of tuition for approved career tech programs




Following the scholarship application process with successful strategy is a plan in knowing how to plan, research, apply and track applications will increase your chances of earning valuable awards. UCanGo2.org offers resources and publications to help in your plan, prepare and pay for your education after high school.

#### PLAN

- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid, or FAFSA, in your senior year of high school and each year you need financial aid for education expenses. Learn more at [federalstudentaid.gov](https://federalstudentaid.gov)
- Investigate the cost of attendance at the school you plan to attend, and determine how much you'll need to cover your expenses. [OkCollegeStart.org](https://okcollegestart.org) can help you find the cost of higher education institutions nationwide.
- Evaluate your resources to determine how you'll pay for college. Consider savings, your current earnings, financial aid and any scholarships you may have already won.
- Create a resume that lists your talents, accomplishments and awards and provide it to those you ask to write letters of recommendation.

#### RESEARCH

- Scholarships are awarded based on a number of factors, including family ethnicity, sports, community service grades, hobbies, test scores, residency, financial need, skills, leadership, essays, college majors and more.
- Search for scholarships from your prospective colleges, third parties, employers, local organizations, Google, books and more.
- Ask your school counselor for scholarship resources.
- Use legitimate scholarship search sites like those found on the next page at [UCanGo2.org](https://ucan-go2.org) and [OkCollegeStart.org](https://okcollegestart.org).
- Align your search to your characteristics and your college and career goals.

#### APPLY

- Read through the application and any requirements for transcripts, essays, and letters of recommendation. Be sure to request/complete these items early.
- Follow instructions, review and proof your application so you're sure there are no mistakes. Ask someone else to proof it, too.
- Write an essay that's captivating, sets you apart, and is original. Use the resources and ask a teacher or counselor to proofread it, as well. Consider the guidance available in our [Scholarship Essay Tips](https://ucan-go2.org) publication.
- Keep copies of your applications, essays, and letters of recommendation. You'll use the same general information on most applications, so copies will come in handy. Reusing an essay you've already used is a good way to save time and improve your quality when it's directly needed.
- Watch out for scholarship scams! Read the print brochure of guarantees, never pay to submit an application and protect your personal information. Learn more about scams at [go.collegeboard.org](https://go.collegeboard.org).

#### TRACK

- Make note of all requirements to ensure you're applying for scholarships for which you're eligible.
- Send thank you notes to those who participated in your application process and to the scholarship providers you are awarded.
- Use a [Scholarship Tracker](https://ucan-go2.org) to organize and keep track of completed applications and upcoming deadlines.
- Understand how a scholarship may impact other financial aid you've been awarded. Check with the college financial aid office if you have questions.

#### FALL CHECKLIST

- FAFSA Time!**
  - Get your Studentaid.gov account. FAFSA applicants must create a [Studentaid.gov](https://studentaid.gov) account prior to starting the FAFSA. This username and password will be used throughout the financial aid process to access and sign the FAFSA, your student loan applications, view your financial aid history, and more.
  - Complete the FAFSA. The FAFSA is your first step in applying for federal and state financial aid. Complete the 2025-27 FAFSA in October of 2025. You'll need your Studentaid.gov account to access and electronically sign the FAFSA. If you're a dependent student, one or both of your parents will also need to create a Studentaid.gov account. Oklahoma Promise students must complete the FAFSA annually in order to receive their funding.
  - Look for Your FAFSA Submission Summary. After you submit the FAFSA, you'll receive a FAFSA Submission Summary via email or postal mail. Review the information provided on the Summary for accuracy. If you find errors, correct the data at [Studentaid.gov](https://studentaid.gov) by contacting your college financial aid office.
  - Learn about Financial Aid. Research grants, work-study and student loan information at [Studentaid.gov](https://studentaid.gov) and [OkCollegeStart.org](https://okcollegestart.org).
- Counselor Communication**
  - Select special classes. Consider taking Advanced Placement or concurrent enrollment courses **year**. Talk to your counselor now about your options. These classes are worth checking out because some offer college credit, which could save you time and money in the long run.
  - Study. Just like your parents said, good grades matter! Stay committed and maintain your grades. These habits will carry over to your college coursework. Find [Study Tips](https://ucan-go2.org) at [UCanGo2.org](https://ucan-go2.org).
  - Stay on track. Review your class schedule with your counselor to make sure you're meeting the high school graduation requirements, Oklahoma's Promise coursework and GPA expectations, and college entrance requirements for the institutions that interest you. Check out the [College Preparation/College Readiness Standards](https://ucan-go2.org) to see Oklahoma's graduation requirements.
- College Connection**
  - Learn More. Attend college fairs in your area (see our [College Fair Worksheet](https://ucan-go2.org)) or on your own; meet with college recruiters and bring an adult FAFSA account from your school year reviews to your questions about enrollment and paying for college.
  - Choose Your Top Picks. Narrow your list of potential colleges based on your research. Your list will probably include three to five colleges. However, you can submit your FAFSA results to up to 20 institutions.
  - Take a Tour. Visit campuses that are a good match for your abilities and career interests. Use the tools found at [UCanGo2.org](https://ucan-go2.org) such as [Visiting the Best of Campus](https://ucan-go2.org) to ensure your campus visits are successful. Many colleges offer virtual tours if you're unable to visit in person. Review our list of Oklahoma institutions that offer virtual tours at [OkCollegeStart.org](https://okcollegestart.org).
  - Fill It Out. Submit college admission applications to your top choices. Be aware of all application deadlines and fees. Your high school may send a College Application Thread to you and your counselor for details. You can also practice your college application with a [sample application form](https://ucan-go2.org) on [OkCollegeStart.org](https://okcollegestart.org).
  - ACT On It. Make sure your official ACT and/or SAT test scores are sent to the colleges to which you're applying. Head to the ACT & SAT report by the sample practice tests on [OkCollegeStart.org](https://okcollegestart.org) to increase your score. Find test locations and dates at [act.org](https://act.org) and [sat.org](https://sat.org).
