The multiyear modernization effort aims to update technology, increase competition by soliciting bids, double federal funding, and update the nearly 40-year-old law, specifically to abolish appropriations caps. While this research could help us prepare for future outbreaks, the stakes of this work are extremely high: if even one dangerous virus escaped a lab, it could cause a global pandemic. - 8. This is your brain on drugs! (all those over 50 say YEAH!) The Federal Drug Administration approved the drug naloxone for over-the-counter sale last week; a move health officials hope will help slow the rise of opioid-related overdose deaths across the US. The drug will be available under the brand name Narcan, a nasal spray-based formulation, by late summer.

Opioid overdoses occur when the brain's opioid receptors are flooded, depressing the central nervous system to the point where breathing slows or ceases (see overview, w/video). Naloxone is an opioid antagonist, blocking the drugs from attaching to the receptors—an effect that allows it to rapidly reverse the effects of an overdose. A study in Massachusetts found more than 90% of overdoses were successfully reversed when the drug was administered by emergency responders.

The previous eight years have seen fatal overdose rates surge, doubling to more than 100,000 since 2015. Visualize the three waves of the opioid crisis <u>here</u>
