By the 2000s, though, the idea had come under fierce attack: Experimental researchers were unable to find a shred of credible evidence that students perform better when instruction is tailored to their "preferred mode" of learning. A 2023 study opens another line of criticism, concluding that learning styles may also lead educators to a species of academic profiling. Teachers and parents rated "visual learners" as more intelligent and "hands-on learners" more athletic by wide margins—and the researchers found that similar misconceptions, like "chemists and engineers are often kinesthetic learners," are sometimes perpetuated in teaching colleges. Learning styles remain one of the more pernicious myths in education. They offer no measurable short-term benefits and, according to the latest research, exact a long-term toll by warping how teachers, parents, and even peers view students' potential. For all the new teachers we've taught this to over the years, we are sorry!!!
