



PK-12 School Districts

Most Oklahoma secondary students participating in career and technology education do so through CareerTech programs in their local schools. Students explore hands-on programs in agricultural education; business, marketing and information technology; family and consumer sciences; health careers; STEM; and trade and industrial education. They meet academic standards while gaining real-world skills in entrepreneurship, technology and career readiness and connecting classroom learning to future career paths.















Technology Centers

Technology centers were designed to diversify Oklahoma's economy by equipping students and adults with the technical skills needed for emerging industries. They provide tuition-free, half-day training to high school students and affordable options for adults looking to gain or upgrade skills. In addition to full-time programs, tech centers also offer short-term training. Many students earn college credit while learning hands-on skills that lead directly to employment.

Business and Industry

Oklahoma CareerTech's business and industry services support employers with customized training, continuing education and workforce development programs that drive economic growth. Through industry-aligned programs, customized corporate training and strategic partnerships, CareerTech helps ensure Oklahoma's workforce remains competitive in an evolving job market.

Skills Centers

Skills Centers deliver CareerTech education to incarcerated adults and justice-involved youth in partnership with the Oklahoma Department of Corrections and the Office of Juvenile Affairs and leads dropout recovery efforts across the state. Skills Centers integrate career training, employability and life skills to help individuals successfully transition from incarceration to the workforce. Students can earn industry-recognized certifications and career readiness credentials that validate their job skills.

Adult Education and Family Literacy

Oklahoma CareerTech's Adult Education and Family Literacy Division provides essential education services to help adults improve literacy, earn high school equivalency certificates and gain workforce skills. The programs help adults gain employment and improve their families' economic opportunities. AEFL's efforts are a vital investment in Oklahoma's people and workforce.

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
