Oklahoma has:

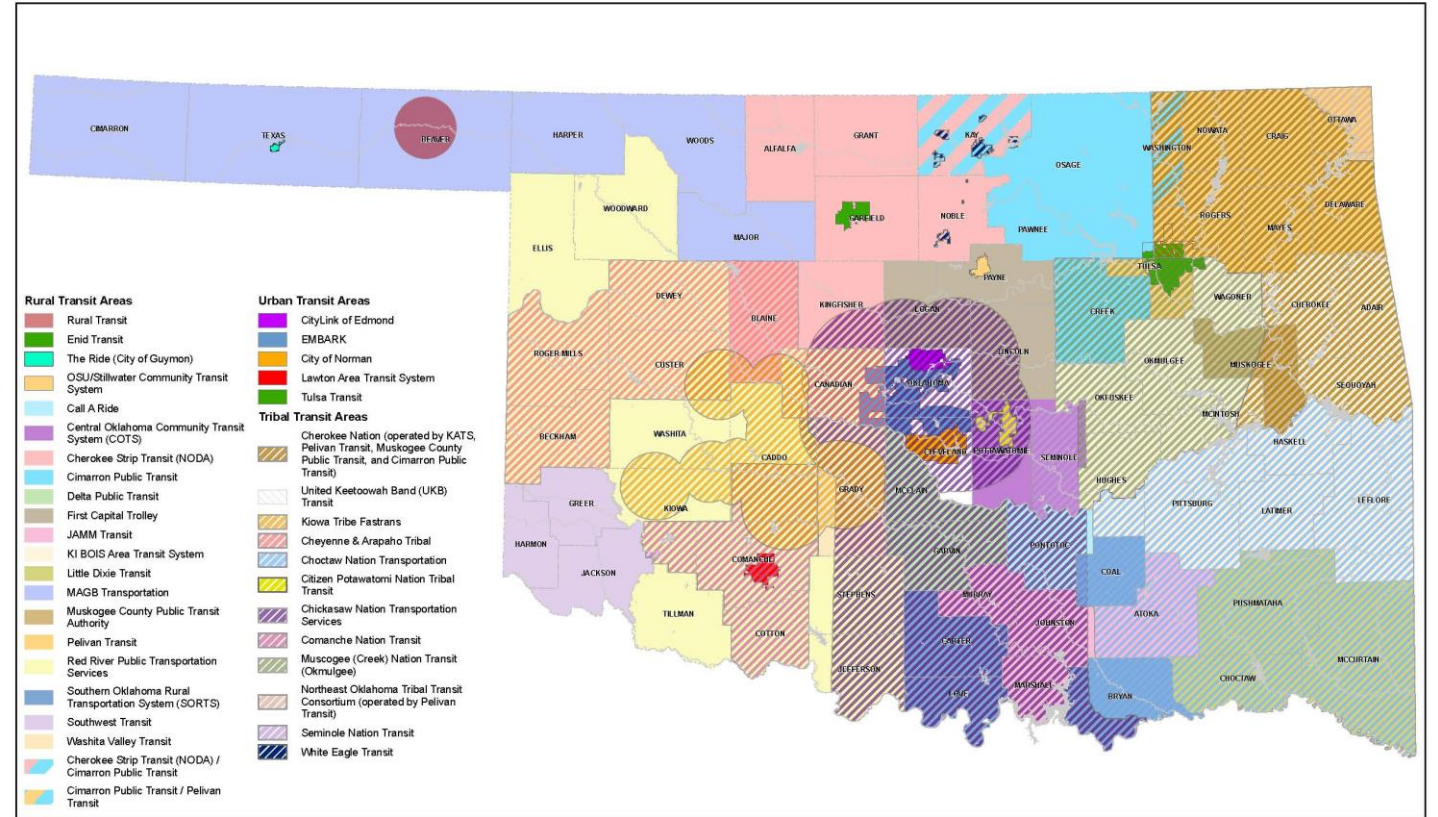
- **Urban & Rural Public Transit**

Contact your local tribal transit provider to find out if they do.

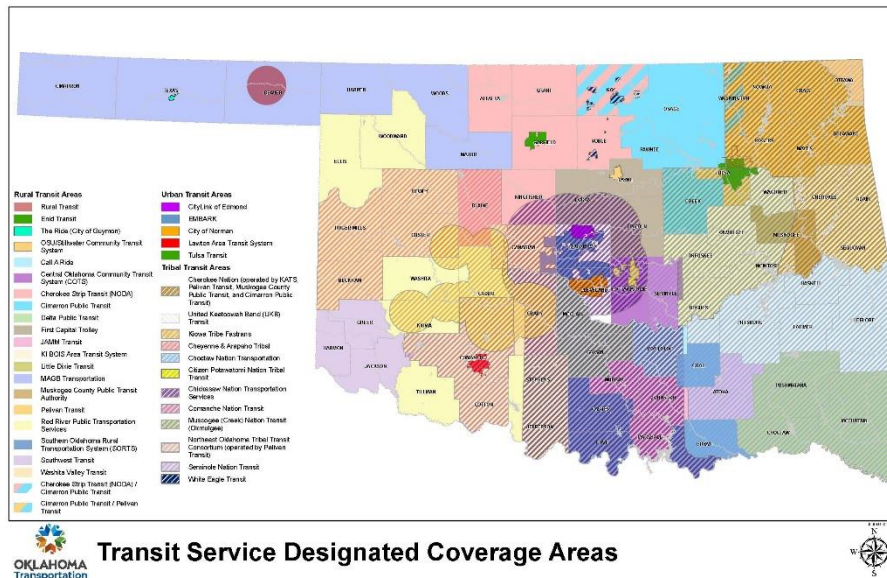
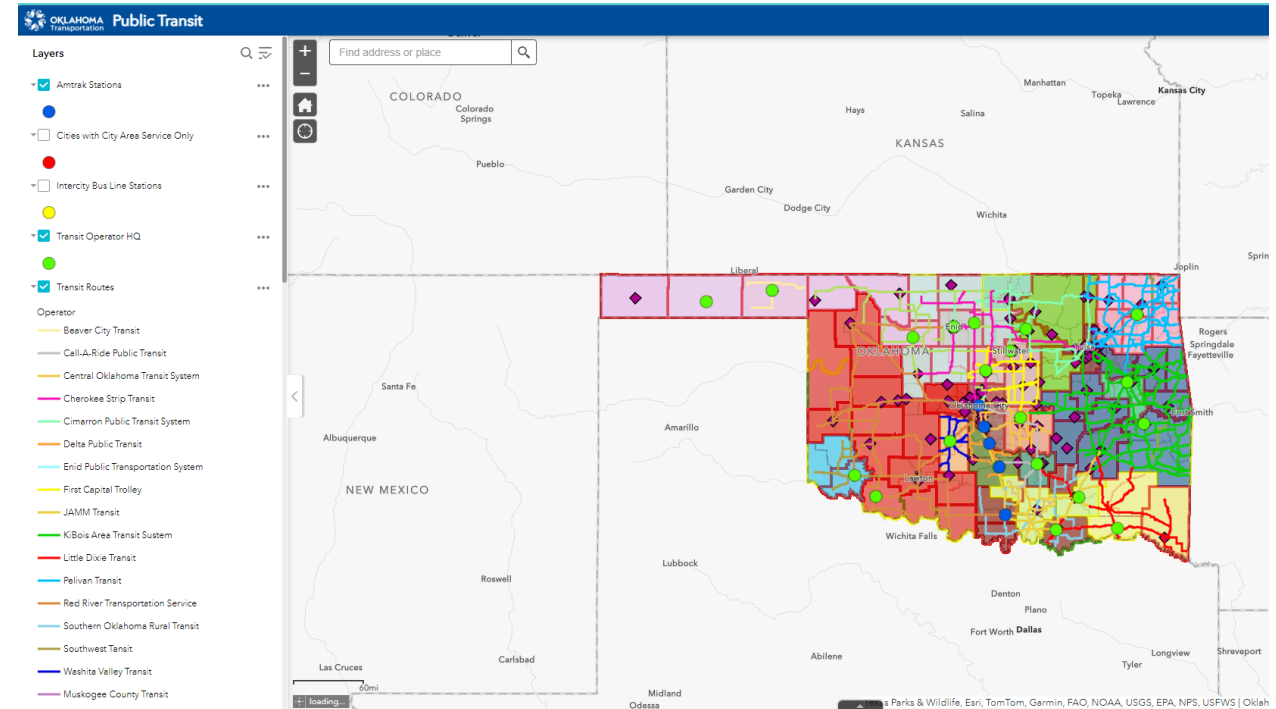


Transit Service Designated Coverage Areas

Intercity Bus 5311-b

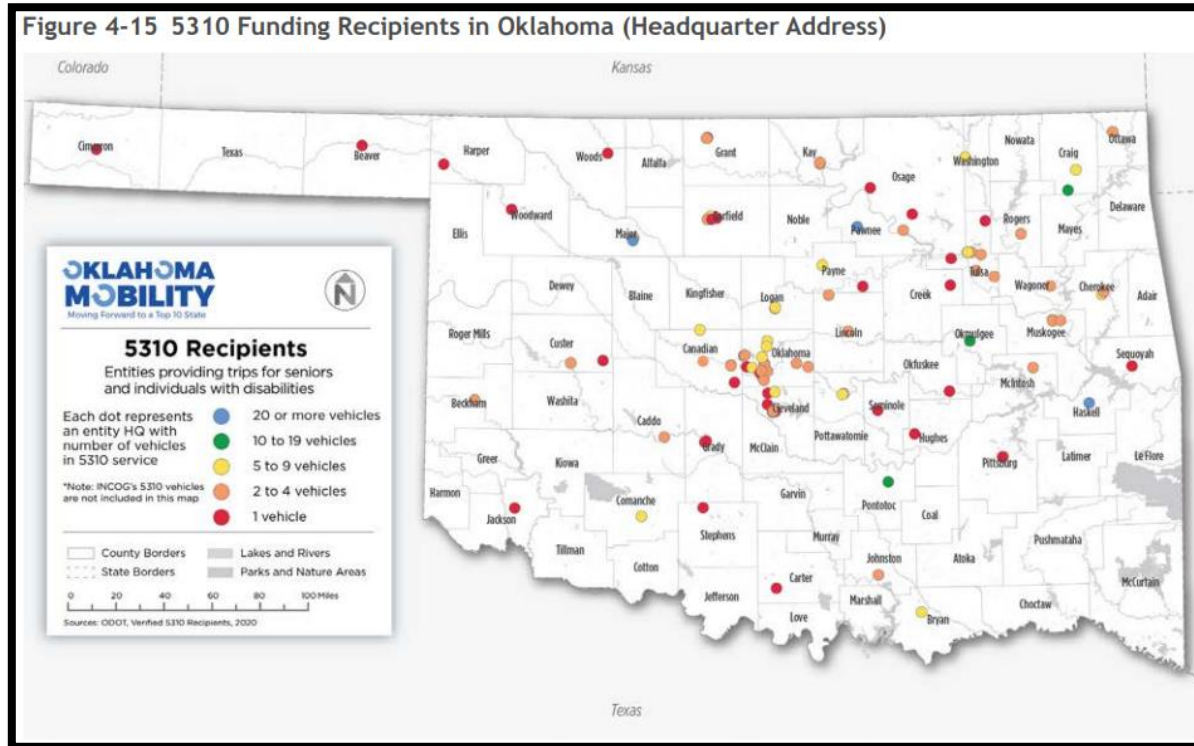


Intercity Buses **must connect rural areas** to a nationwide network (air, ferry, other bus services)

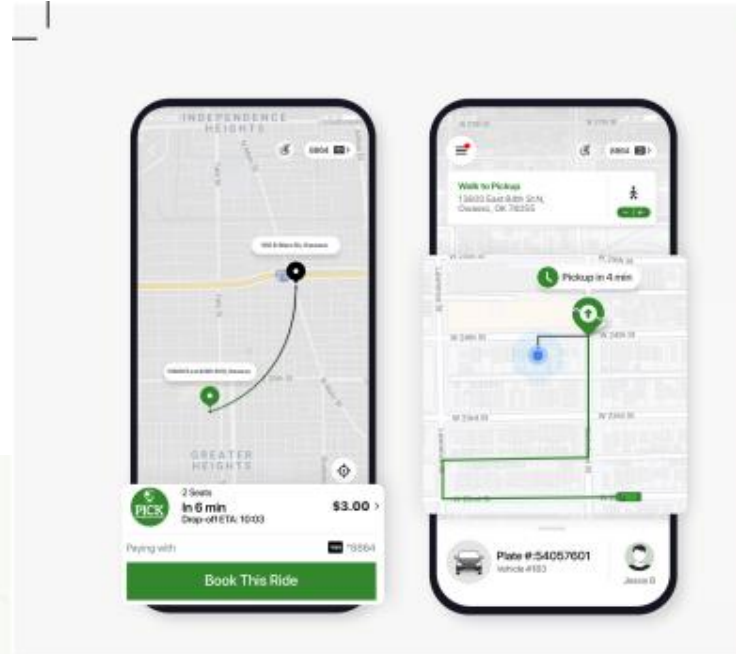

PICK is an on-demand ride service, meaning it doesn't follow a specific schedule or routes like traditional public transit.

How to book a ride.

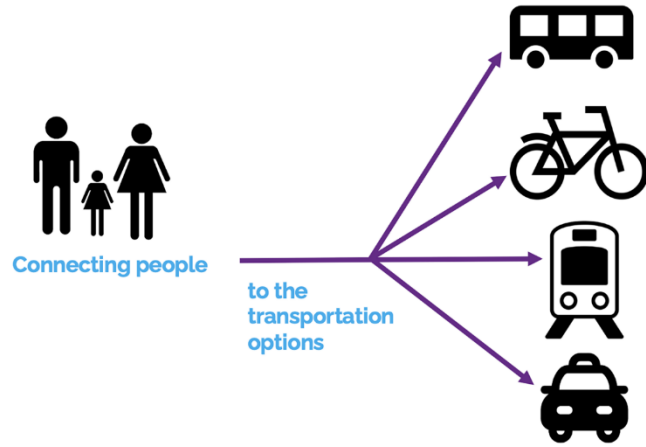
- 1. Create an account.**
Download the PICK app from the App Store or Google Play Store and follow the simple signup steps. You can also call us at 855-735-4826.
- 2. Book a ride.**
Enter your pickup and dropoff addresses, choose the ride that works best for you, and tap Book This Ride.
- 3. Meet your driver.**
Check the app to find exactly when you should head outside to meet the vehicle. We'll pick you up and drop you off steps from your door.

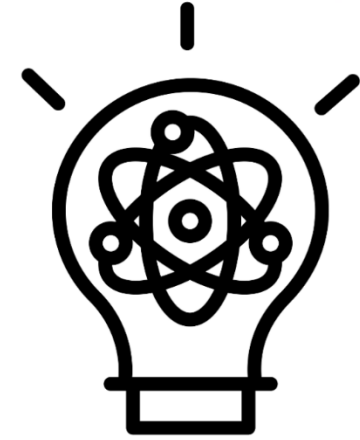

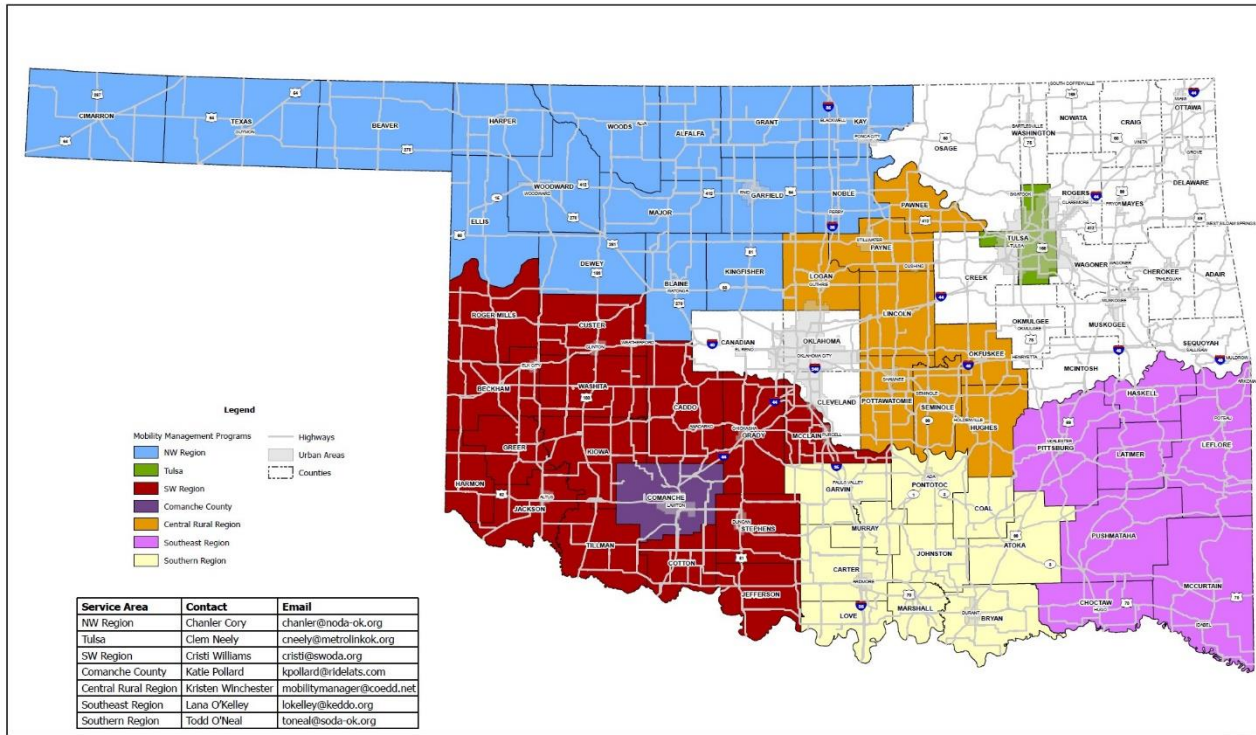

Oklahoma currently has 7 mobility management programs

The Mobility Management Program started in 2023 and ODOT's goal to implement enough programs serve 100% of OK w/ no gaps in mobility management support

- Program launched in 2023 and we currently have 7/25 mobility management programs covering 57/77 counties.
- Funding primarily coming from 5310 and community foundation grants
- More MM programs are needed on a regional and local level to provide more support to communities- current model is the start of this.
- **OKC starts in 7/2024!**

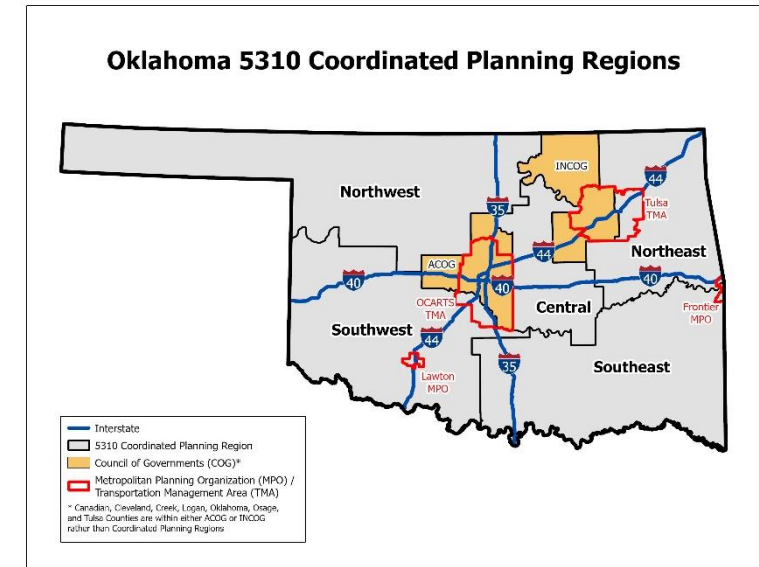
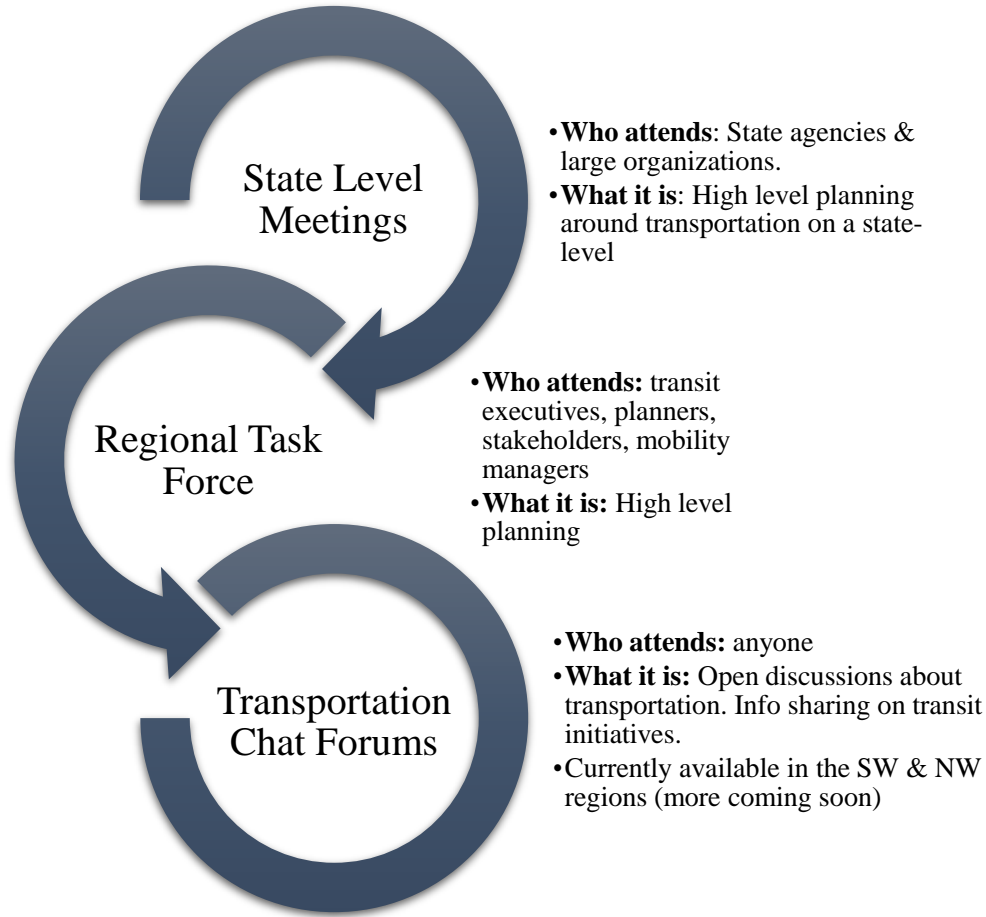
