Office of Head Start Priorities



OHS has an unwavering commitment to equity, inclusion, and belonging. Each program's leadership is key to this effort, as they create conditions favorable for a program culture that facilitates opportunities for staff, families, and community partners to have safe spaces for open dialogue about equity and to develop actionable strategies that promote belonging and address bias in the program's systems and services. More than ever, equity is the foundation of the Head Start program and a lens that informs each of our priorities.


OHS Priorities, cont.

- ► Child Health & Safety Reduce/eliminate children's risk of exposure to harm and hazards.
- ▶ Partnerships with State Systems Expand Head Start's capacity to coordinate services with State systems and national programs.
- ▶ **Reaching Children & Families** Ensuring that Head Start resources are targeted to children, families, and communities of greatest need.
- ▶ **Investing in Workforce** Supporting a highly-skilled workforce with competitive pay, benefits, and access to supports for staff wellness.
- ▶ **Quality Environments** Strengthening the key components of infrastructure that assist Head Start programs with operating most effectively.

Updated Collaboration Office Priorities

- 1. Collaborate with state systems to align early care and education services and supports for children and families prenatally to age five.
- 2. Work with state efforts to collect and use data on early childhood programs to guide decision-making and improve child and family outcomes.
- 3. Support the expansion of and access to high quality workforce and career development opportunities for staff.
- 4. Coordinate with school systems to ensure continuity and alignment across programs, as appropriate.
- 5. State and regional priorities as needed.
