Instructor Ryan Delmore, has served as a Deputy Sheriff since 2013 and is currently a Narcotics Investigator with the Baldwin County Sheriff's Office and a Task Force Officer with the Drug Enforcement Administration, assigned to HIDTA Group 47 at the Mobile, Alabama Resident Office within the New Orleans Field Division. In 2015, he joined the Special Operations Unit, targeting criminal activity along I-10 and I-65. He has worked alongside numerous state, federal, and international agencies, including the DEA, HSI, FBI, ATF, USSS, USPIS, INTERPOL, the U.S. Attorney's Office, the Alabama Attorney General's Office, and the U.S. Department of State, conducting investigations that resulted in the seizure of millions in U.S. Currency, thousands of pounds of narcotics, firearms, and explosives. He has extensive experience in identifying hidden compartments in vehicles, conducting controlled deliveries, and managing high-level federal and state conspiracy cases, Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Force operations, and Title III investigations. Ryan has been awarded Deputy of the Quarter, Deputy of the Year, and Investigator of the Year, as well as commendations from the Baldwin County District Attorney's Office, Homeland Security Investigations, the Alabama Attorney General's Office, and the U.S. Attorney's Office. In 2025, he and two DEA co-case agents received the National HIDTA Award for "Investigation Involving Innovative Approaches", and he was nominated for the DEA Administrator's Award.
