THE INSTRUCTOR for this training course, will be investigator David Newman (RET) from the Norfolk Police Department in Virginia. Investigator Newman began his career in law-enforcement in 1984 and retired from the Norfolk Police Department in late 2009. His experience with the Norfolk P.D. includes over 15 years in the detective division serving in homicide & forensics and involvement in over 1000 death investigations and high-profile homicides. While serving in forensics he has investigated over 2500 cases including an additional 65 homicide investigations and over 500 crime scenes. Investigator Newman received his bachelor's degree from Old Dominion University in 1986 in Criminal Justice and a minor in psychology and has lectured several thousand hours to law enforcement agencies at all levels across the country on the topic of homicide investigation and its related forensic applications. His courses have been taught in conjunction with the Virginia State Division of Forensic Science and the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner. Investigator Newman has also instructed basic and advanced forensics at Thomas Nelson College in Virginia, equivocal death scenes at the Virginia State Division of Forensic Science and is a qualified expert in death investigation and its related forensic fields. His expertise in crime scene management through the development of protocol procedures have been adopted by several agencies across the country with great success. Inv. David Newman continues to provide aid in cold cases, 911 assessment evaluation and provides expert courtroom testimony totaling over 39 years of experience.

COURSE TOPICS ARE TO INCLUDE:

- * Identify the neutral baseline that defines a homicide investigation from discovery to successful prosecution to include phases, stages and responsibilities.
- * Developing models to manage the defined baseline based on agency size, resources and structure.
- * List and describe the various forensic applications in death investigation from the scene to the lab setting.
- * Structuring a computer case management system to classify and track unsolved homicides from cold cases to inactive homicides. Tracking from specific category to a point value system of solvability.
- * Illustrate the scientific method as an application to management including parallels to independent and dependent variables through various stages of the investigation.
- * Demonstrate how to draft protocol for suicide, equivocal & infant death from specific stages in the active phase baseline.
- * Primary vs. Secondary crime scenes and indications of comfort zones.
- * Illustrate victim & suspect association when victim risk assessment and method of operation are consistent.
- * Review Locard's Principle of Transfer and its application during the active phase evaluation.
- * Discuss suicide & equivocal death investigation to include elements, demographics & victim risk assessment.
- * Define and show examples of signature, M.O. and motive through case review.
- * DNA review to cover genetic genealogy, phenotyping familial searching, M-Vac, Bardole and Soaking Sonication.
- * Key association indicators between suspect and victim. (Victimology assessment and behavioral analysis).
- * VICAP review and its application in unsolved violent crimes.
- * Rules of evidence and terminology.
- * Victim Identification (Presumptive vs. Positive)
- * Recognizing time of death, cause of death and injury patterns.
- * Unresolved homicide investigation to include identifying causal factors and strategies.
- * SIDS and infant homicide & death investigation.

Inside the Tape conducts free unsolved homicide case analysis for any law enforcement agency. We limit analysis to 3 cases a month and once the analysis is complete, we establish a virtual link with the submitting agency to conduct the review. The following information is needed and can be provided on a thumb drive or by email. Evidence review for re-submission for DNA analysis is possible with MVAC, Bardole or soaking/sonication.

- *All 911 audio recordings
- *Offense report
- *Scene photographs
- *Investigators' notes
- *Witness statements 6
- *Victimology risk factors and 24-hour factor victimology
- *Evidence recovery sheets and all lab analysis
- *Autopsy report
