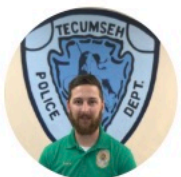

Domestic violence calls are some of the most complex, high-liability, and high-risk cases patrol officers respond to. An effective response requires more than separating parties and writing a report — it demands a clear understanding of victim behavior, trauma, legal standards, and evidence-based investigative practices that support successful prosecution.

This breakout session is a condensed version of the full 8-hour Evidence-Based Domestic Violence Investigations course. In this one-hour overview, attendees will receive focused, practical insights into the most critical components of domestic violence investigations, including:

- Domestic violence laws and statutory definitions
- The dynamics of abuse and barriers to victim reporting
- Trauma-informed interviewing techniques
- Strangulation awareness and investigative priorities
- Statutory obligations and officer liability
- Protective orders and enforcement considerations
- Evidence collection and report writing that supports prosecution

While compressed to fit a one-hour conference format, this session delivers high-impact takeaways patrol officers can immediately apply in the field. The goal is to strengthen investigations, improve victim outcomes, and enhance prosecutorial success through evidence-based practices.
