Human Trafficking Response Unit (HTRU)

Basic Human Trafficking 4 hours CLEET #25-3486

This class aims to strengthen officers' ability to conduct victim-centered, trauma-informed interactions that prioritize safety, build trust, and reduce the risk of re-traumatization. Participants learn the applicable federal and state laws, elements of trafficking offenses, evidence collection strategies, and best practices for collaborating with prosecutors, child welfare agencies, service providers.

Human Trafficking Enforcement- Identify/ Investigate/ Prosecute, 8 hours CLEET #26-0285

Designed to enhance an officer's ability to identify, investigate, and support the successful prosecution of human trafficking cases. The training focuses on recognizing indicators of both sex and labor trafficking, understanding offender methods and victim vulnerabilities, and distinguishing trafficking from related offenses such as prostitution, smuggling, or domestic violence.

Drug Endangered Children/ The connection between DEC and human trafficking, 4 hours CLEET #25-3243

The overall goal of the class is to shift from a purely drug-focused response to a child-centered, multidisciplinary approach that treats the child as a victim in need of immediate protection while strengthening cases against perpetrators.

Drug Endangered Children/Human Trafficking- Identify & Intervention 8 hours CLEET #26-0562

This course focuses on the nexus to human trafficking, designed to help law enforcement, child welfare professionals, and multidisciplinary partners recognize, assess, and respond to children who are at risk due to substance abuse, exploitation, and trafficking. The training emphasizes the identification of children living in environments impacted by drug use, manufacturing, or distribution, as well as those who may be vulnerable to or actively experiencing human trafficking.

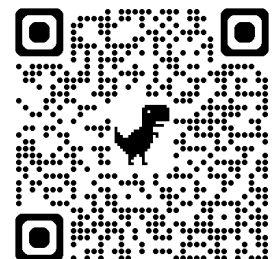
Human Trafficking in Hotels & Gaming 8 hours CLEET# 26-1415

This course is for law enforcement and Hotel/Casino staff designed to enhance officers' ability to identify, investigate, and disrupt human trafficking activity occurring within hospitality, lodging, and gaming environments. The training focuses on recognizing indicators of both sex and labor trafficking in hotels, casinos, resorts, and related venues, where traffickers often exploit the anonymity, high traffic, and transient nature of these locations.

Human Trafficking/At-Risk Youth 4 hours CLEET# 26-0765

This course is for law enforcement designed to equip officers with the knowledge and skills necessary to identify, protect, and respond effectively to youth who are vulnerable to trafficking and exploitation. The training focuses on recognizing risk factors such as prior abuse or neglect, family instability, homelessness, foster care involvement, substance use, and online exploitation.
