

Tracking and Reconnaissance

Phase 1

Learning Goal:

The students will gain the knowledge and skills to effectively and efficiently track suspects or missing persons across various terrains. The students will gain the skills to overcome any obstacles while conducting reconnaissance.

Performance Objectives:

- 1) The student will gain the knowledge and understanding of common terms/definitions used in the tracking world.
- 2) The student will understand how to utilize various tools/resources to aid while tracking and conducting reconnaissance.
- 3) The student will have the knowledge to render aid in a high stress environment.
- 4) The student will be able to identify common sole patterns.
- 5) The student will gain the knowledge to read and understand the map and its components.
- 6) The student will be able to identify clues and signs that will aid in tracking.
- 7) The student will understand the positives and negatives of various weather conditions while tracking and/or conducting reconnaissance.
- 8) The student will understand moon illumination and how it affects tracking.
- 9) The student will gain the knowledge to setting security while conducting reconnaissance.
- 10) The student will gain the knowledge of various security formations to utilize in various terrain conditions.
- 11) Students will be able to conduct reconnaissance across various terrains.
- 12) Students will understand the Routine Activity Theory.

Condition and Standards:

Students will be deemed to have successfully completed Tracking and Reconnaissance Phase 1, by participation in classroom, practical demonstrations, and end of phase test that must be passed with no less than 80%. You must be a full-time or reserve certified peace officer in the State of Oklahoma in order to attend this training. You must be in good standing with your agency and/or CLEET.

Comments:

This Phase is just ONE of FIVE phases. In order to progress through the phases, you MUST complete the phase prior (i.e.: you must complete and pass phase one to move onto phase two, you must complete phase two to move onto phase three).
