6. Legislative update – Laura Grisso-Eyster

Ms. Grisso-Eyster reported on each of the three bills that could potentially affect the Massage industry in Oklahoma.

SB633 by Sen Daniels, District 29, Bartlesville, Skiatook, Claremore. Massage Therapy Practice Act, modifying various provisions, adding establishment licensure. This is the bill we worked on, Sen Daniels did make some edits, and there are some corrections we have sent her on verbiage. As of 2.15.23 at noon, there was no date set to be heard in committee.

HB2514 by Rep Ajay Pittman, District 99 Oklahoma City Massage Therapy Practice Act, modifying various provisions, adding establishment licensure. Rep Pittman did make some edits and we sent her come corrections on verbiage. As of 2.15.23 at noon, there was no date set to be heard in committee.

HB 2333 Rep. Jeff Boatman, District 67 Tulsa, Bixby Oklahoma Massage Parlor Licensing Reform, this is a deregulation bill. As of 2.15.23 at noon, there was no date set to be heard in committee.
