**REQUEST FOR FUNDING PROPOSAL  
2026 VICTIMS OF CRIME ACT (VOCA) GRANT**

**AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS**

The District Attorneys Council announces the opening of the 2026 Victims of Crime Act Grant (VOCA) request for proposal process. The Department of Justice has not released the VOCA allocations for 2026 due to pending budget negotiations in Congress. The DAC is accepting grant proposals in advance of this announcement, in anticipation of continued VOCA grant funding.

**WHAT IS VOCA?**

The purpose of the VOCA grant is to provide **direct services** to victims of crime. Services are defined as those efforts that (1) respond to the emotional and physical needs of crime victims; (2) assist primary and secondary victims of crime to stabilize their lives after victimization; (3) assist victims to understand and participate in the criminal justice system; and (4) provide victims of crime with a measure of safety and security.

**ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS**

To be eligible for funding from the VOCA grant, an applicant must be one of the following:

- A state agency
- A unit of local government (i.e., city, county)
- A tribal government
- A non-profit agency

**PROGRAM PURPOSES**

The nine-member VOCA Board has the authority to award funds to various programs in order to meet the needs of crime victims in Oklahoma. **Note: All funding decisions of the Board are final.**

The state must use a minimum of 40% of the VOCA grant in the following purpose areas:

Minimum % of awarded funds	Description
10%	Programs that support Child Abuse victims
10%	Programs that support Domestic Violence victims
10%	Programs that support Sexual Assault victims
10%	Programs that support Under Served victims

Underserved victimization includes, but is not limited to: DUI, assault, adults molested as children, elder abuse, robbery, survivors of homicide victims, other violent crimes and economic exploitation/fraud.

## **ALLOWABLE COSTS**

## **BASIC FINANCIAL AND PROGRAMMATIC REQUIREMENTS**

VOCA recipients are required:

- To utilize volunteers;
- To comply with all reporting requirements, both financial and programmatic; and
- Collect and report statistics on services provided and persons served.

## **REQUIREMENTS TO APPLY**

VOCA grant funding requests can only be made online: <https://ogx.ok.gov/>

Applicants must first register as a User in OGX and wait for approval (through an e-mailed response) before access into the system is allowed. Once approved, applicants can apply for the VOCA grant. Information about registration procedures can be accessed at <https://www.sam.gov/SAM/>. **Applications without a UEI will not be reviewed.**

Solicitation Date: **Open from December 23, 2025 – March 6, 2026**

Deadline for submission: **11:59 p.m., March 6, 2026**

Grant Project period: **October 1, 2026 - September 30, 2027**
