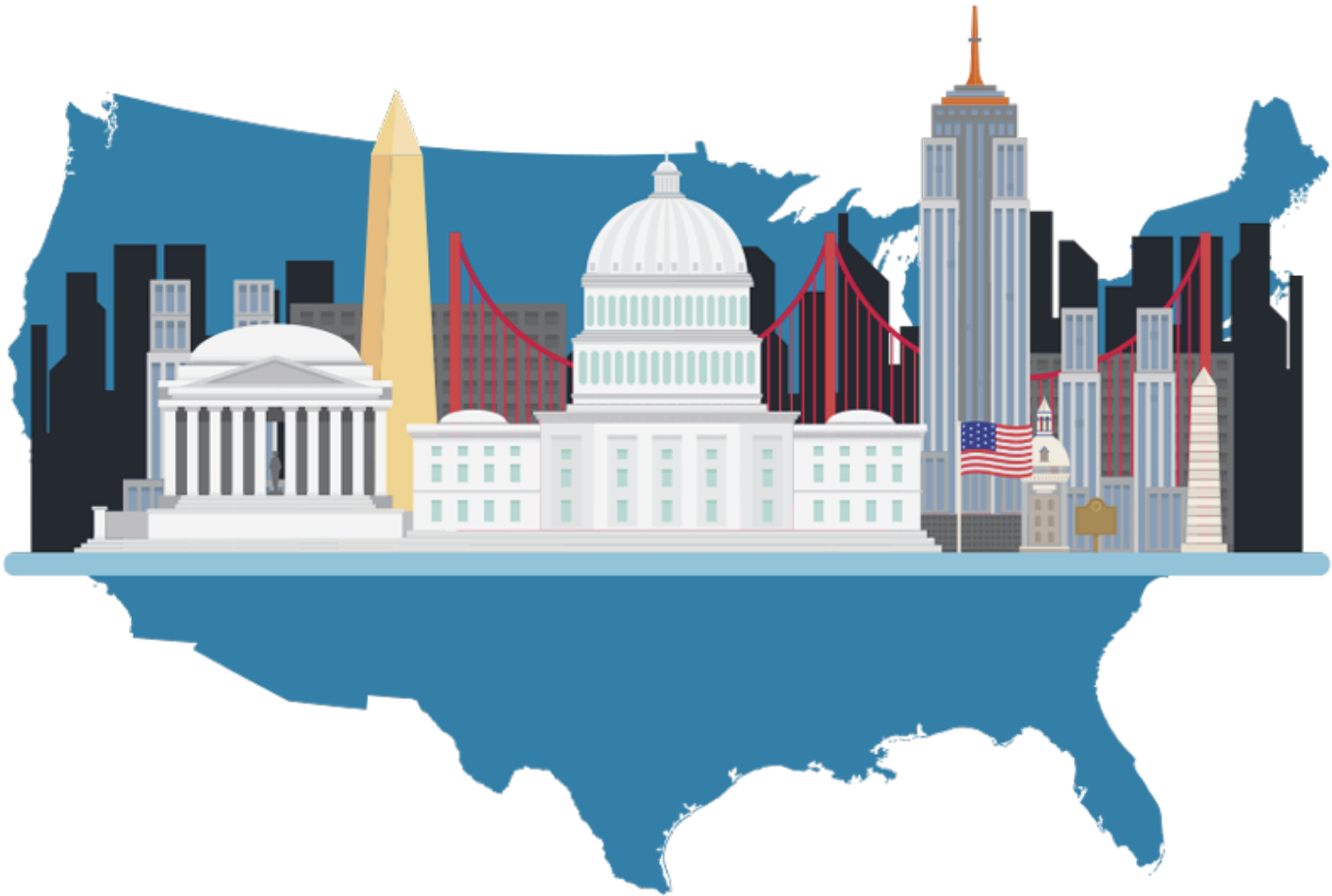

Project: Wearables for Wellness

Organization: University of Kansas

Proposal Description:

The use of wearable technology by consumers to self-direct their healthcare has grown exponentially over the last decade. Additionally, more managed care organizations and insurance providers are requiring the use of wearables to monitor health to prevent chronic and acute health issues to reduce their own internal costs. As more of these organizations require the use of wearables to monitor health, individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) will be asked to use technologies that may or may not be accessible to them, creating additional technological barriers. Unfortunately, cognitive accessibility, is rarely considered during the design and testing of health-related wearable technology. To support the advancement of inclusive design and user experience, research on accessibility of health tracking wearables must be completed. This study is being done with Developmental Disabilities Services, Oklahoma ABLE Tech, Oklahoma State University, and the University of Kansas. The Developmental Disabilities Council of Oklahoma is a partner with this study at this time, though has not been given to date.

As this project has developed, an instructional (how-to video) for participants involved in the Wearables for Wellness Study understand how to complete the survey was not budgeted. The referenced survey tool is ATLAS, which stands for Accessible Testing Learning & Assessment Systems. ATLAS is used to support cognitive accessibility of online surveys using strategies such as error minimization, audio descriptions, images, and simple navigation. The Wearables for Wellness program is using the ATLAS systems as the primary method of administering our validated *Technology Needs* self-directed survey. Established in 2012, the *Technology Needs* survey investigates technology uses, barriers, and needs for people with IDD. The proposed project will add a new feature to the ATLAS administered *Technology Needs* survey by creating a video tutorial to the measurement so that people with IDD can complete the online survey more independently with clearer instructions and demonstrations of practice questions. The inclusion of an introductory video adds to the accessibility of a well-established measurement tool for future access and replicability

75-100 adults with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities

The rest of the FY24 year. Video would be created as soon as possible for use with participants of the study. This video would help participants understand how to complete the survey.

This video will ensure success / completion of surveys to help us with understanding the impact on persons with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities health outcomes if wearing wearables.
