By roll call, it was determined there was not a quorum of members for business to be conducted.

III.  Review of the June 7, 2024, Minutes of the ATO Committee Meetings.




ACTION: Ms. Fugitt gave the committee time to review the minutes from June 7, 2024. Since no quorum was present no voting was conducted to approve the minutes.

Ms. Duplan recommends that incorporating past graduates with children to be involved. These may be ways to increase awareness and reach different areas of the state.

 DISCUSSION: Ms. Randle Self-advocacy trainings are continuing to go well and there are talks of updating the sexuality curriculum. Open discussion and ideas with the members to collectively come to agreement on how the new sexuality curriculum should be presented and different formats.


d) Council Marketing/Outreach:

 DISCUSSION: Ms. Randle discussed that the month of August they are promoting "Able to Save". Social media posts will be focused on Able accounts for that month. The following month is "Emergency Preparedness" month. Again, there will be a big focus on this initiative as well for that month. The month of November will be trying to highlight giving back and promote our self-advocates volunteering. In the month of December self-advocacy will be promoted and what it is for this entire month. Ms. Randle briefly discusses the changes made to the flier to include the new artwork and mission statement.

e) OK STABLE updates:


 DISCUSSION: Ms. Randle reported there are over 2144 total STABLE Accounts at this time. With an increase of 391 accounts since last report date.
