INFRASTRUCTURE

Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Programs (DWSRF)

Loan Program

For water projects that include new construction, expansion and rehabilitation of water facilities for drinking water treatment, supply, distribution, and storage for counties, towns, municipalities, and rural water districts. (WQD)

Lead Service Line Replacement/Inventory

For Public Water Supply (PWS) Lead Service Line Inventory and Replacement Projects for counties, towns, municipalities, and rural water districts. (WQD)

Emerging Contaminants

For PWS Emerging Contaminant Projects for counties, towns, municipalities, rural water districts (WQD)

Rural Infrastructure Grant DEQ/Oklahoma Rural Water Association (ORWA) Partnership

For infrastructure projects for counties, towns, municipalities, rural water or wastewater districts less than 3,300 in population. (WQD)

Clean Vessel Act

For replacement and improvement of items such as floating restrooms and pump out boats to help keep sewage out of Oklahoma lakes. (ECLS)

MATERIALS MANAGEMENT

Environmental Officer Grants

To curtail illegal dumping by providing funding for a part-time Environmental Officer. (LPD)

Solid Waste Equipment Grants

To purchase solid waste management equipment such as brush chippers, balers, composting equipment, and more. (LPD)

Recycling Collection Event Grants

To host community events for the collection and proper disposal or recycling of electronic waste, household hazardous waste, tires, and more. (LPD)

Food Waste Management Grants

For a wide range of projects that reduce wasted food by diverting from disposal to higher use or reuse such as community food recovery programs. (LPD)

Professional Services Grants

For solid waste technical assistance, sustainability, education, beautification, cleanups, and more. (LPD)

Recycled Tire Market Development Grants

To encourage the use of recycled tire materials in things like playground equipment or asphalt trails. (LPD)

Community Revitalization Program

Provides technical assistance to municipalities for the assessment and/or cleanup of sites or buildings with environmental hazards. (LPD)

Brownfields Revolving Loan Program

Provides environmental cleanup assistance for eligible entities in the form of low-interest loans and subgrants. (LPD)

Targeted Brownfields Assessments

Provides free environmental assessments and sampling for non-profit and government entities interested in developing abandoned or underused properties. (LPD)

Tire Dump Cleanup Assistance

Provides tire dump cleanup assistance for eligible public and private entities. (LPD)

Sharps Management Grant Program

For disposal options used for medical sharps. (LPD)

SCHOOLS/RESIDENTIAL

School Chemical Disposal Program

Provides free one-time disposal of unused, outdated, and potentially dangerous chemicals from public school laboratories. (LPD)

Radon Testing

Provides free test kits to residential properties. Free school testing is also available. (LPD)

Clean Diesel Program

Replaces diesel school buses with new school buses. Project types can change year to year (AQD)

Lead Testing for Drinking Water in Schools and Child Care Facilities

To remediate lead impacted drinking water fixtures in public schools and day care facilities. (WQD)

Environmental Education Grant

Supports PreK-12 teachers, school environmental clubs, youth group leaders, and youth organizations to develop hands-on, curriculum-based environmental education or conservation projects. (OCE)

AQD – Air Quality Division

ECLS – Environmental Complaints and Local Services Division

LPD – Land Protection Division

OCE – Office of Communications and Education
