Cleanup Recommendations Following Wildfires

Rock, Brick, Concrete and Asphalt

 Not considered solid waste and may be left in place or buried.

Household Waste (Including Bedding and Clothing)

Your usual household waste disposal method.

Furniture and Carpet

- Take to a permitted landfill or transfer station.
- Do not burn or bury.

Building Materials (shingles, siding, sheetrock, treated lumber, pvc pipe, wiring, etc.)

- Take to a permitted landfill or transfer station.
- Do not burn or bury.

Metal Appliances, Cars and Other Bulky Metal Items

- Try to recycle or take to a salvage yard.
- Take to a permitted landfill or transfer station.

Computers, TVs and Other Electronics

- Try to recycle components.
- Take to a permitted landfill or transfer station.

Chemicals (explosives, fuel containers, pressurized gas cylinders, chlorine, batteries, paint, etc.)

- Check with local officials to determine if a local household hazardous waste collection center is available.
- Check with your local landfill, transfer station, or trash pick-up service provider to see what they will accept.
- You may call DEQ at (800) 522-0206 for assistance in determining the proper method of disposal.
- Do not burn or bury.
