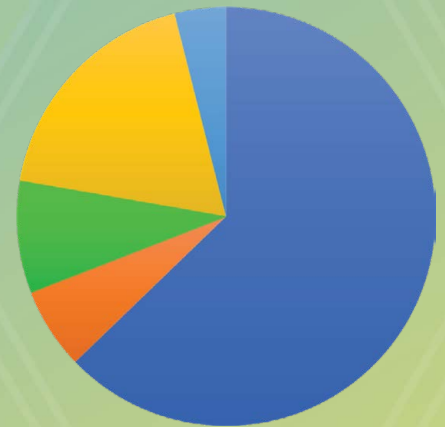

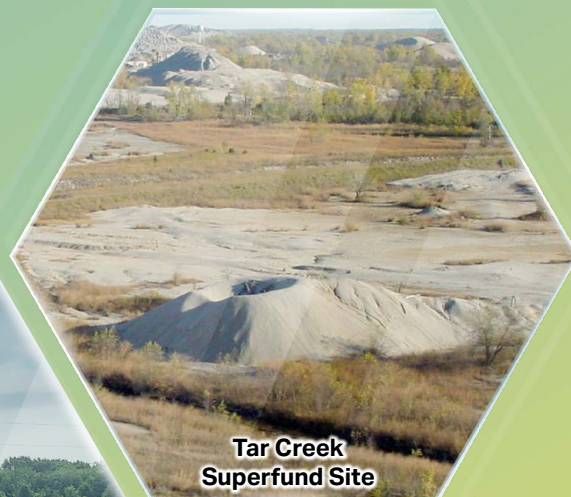
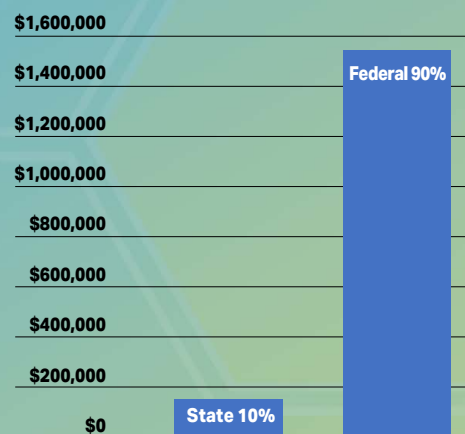
Site Investigation and Hazardous Waste Cleanup

DEQ manages the operations and maintenance activities on recently cleaned up abandoned hazardous waste sites and will continue to monitor these sites to ensure they are safely reused. DEQ also continues to investigate other potential orphan hazardous waste sites.

Superfund Site Cleanup

DEQ Manages cleanup at several Superfund Sites and has a statutory obligation to fund 10 percent of the cleanup costs. The DEQ is currently focusing on protecting human health and the environment by cleaning up rural and residential properties, parks and local watersheds within the Tar Creek Superfund Site.
