



Election Notice for Uniformed Services and Overseas Voters General Election November 5, 2024

Updated: August 1, 2024

The State of Oklahoma will hold a **General Election** on **November 5, 2024**, for candidates seeking the following offices:

U.S. Representative (Districts 1, 2, 4, and 5) – District 3 was decided during the June 18 Primary, since only three Republican candidates filed for office.

Corporation Commissioner

State Senator (odd-numbered districts) – 24 seats

State Senator, District 46 (Special Election for an unexpired term)

State Representative – 101 seats

The following county offices will also appear on the ballot: County Commissioner (District 2), County Court Clerk, County Clerk, and County Sheriff. Some voters may also have local elections.

In addition to the offices listed above, two state questions will also appear on the ballot:

- SQ 833, Legislative Referendum 376 (subject: public infrastructure districts)
- SQ 834, Legislative Referendum 377 (subject: qualification of electors)

Candidate information will be updated following the August 27 Runoff Primary.

The election and candidate list will be available on the State Election Board website following the August 27 Runoff Primary Election at <https://hosting.okelections.us/electionlist.html>. A list of candidates is also available in the Candidate Filing Portal at <https://filings.okelections.us/>. To date, no State Questions are scheduled to appear on the General Election ballot.

Eligible Uniformed Services and overseas voters who **are registered** to vote in Oklahoma and want to receive absentee ballots for the General Election may submit an Absentee Ballot Application electronically through the Oklahoma Voter Portal at <https://okvoterportal.okelections.us/>.

Eligible Uniformed Services and overseas voters who **are not registered** in Oklahoma may register to vote and request absentee ballots using the Federal Post Card Application (FPCA). The FPCA and submission instructions can be found on the Federal Voting Assistance Program (FVAP) website at <https://www.fvap.gov/oklahoma>. Applicants may submit the FPCA by mail, e-mail, or fax to the County Election Board in their county of residence. Contact information for each County Election Board is available on the FVAP website at <https://www.fvap.gov/search-offices?state=36>.

All Absentee Ballot Applications must be received by the appropriate County Election Board or the State Election Board no later than 5 p.m. (CST), Monday, October 21, 2024. The deadline to register to vote is Friday, October 11, 2024.

Those eligible for Uniformed Services and overseas absentee ballots are encouraged to have absentee ballots electronically delivered to allow enough time to receive, vote, and submit their ballot. Those who do not receive their absentee ballot, may opt to submit a Federal

Write-In Ballot, which is available on the Federal Voting Assistance Program (FVAP) website at <https://www.fvap.gov/oklahoma>.

To use the Federal Write-In Ballot, voters will mark the ballot with their choice for each office, question, and/or proposition on the ballot using their sample ballot available in the OK Voter Portal at <https://okvoterportal.okelections.us/>. An election list may also be obtained from the voter's County Election Board or the State Election Board. If the voter receives the requested absentee ballot **after submitting** a Federal Write-In Ballot, the voter should vote and submit the requested absentee ballot. **Only one ballot will be counted.**
