Foreign Agent Political Activity Oversight Act

SB 2180 (Sen. Daniels & Jett & Rep. Lepak)

- Requires a Foreign Principal to register with the Secretary of State
 - Defines a foreign principal as a foreign country, government, high-ranking government official, political party, or business entity with at least a 51 percent interest that is owned or controlled by a foreign country, government, high-ranking government official, or political party
 - Agents must complete registration within 15 days of employment and pay a registration fee. The registration must include: the identity of the agent and the foreign principal employing them; beginning and end dates of employment; and the nature of the lobbying the agent is conducting for the foreign principal.
 - Agents are required to notify the Secretary of State within 10 days of any changes or termination. Persons who violate the provisions of this measure could be found guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to a \$500 fine.

► ERA 2025-06 Modification of Ethics Rule 5.3

Adding provision for Lobbyist disclosure of “Countries of Particular Concern”. Amended to read as follows:

“...Information on the registration shall include the legislative liaison or legislative lobbyist’s name, business address, including electronic mail address and business telephone numbers, the name and address of each lobbyist principal by whom the liaison or lobbyist is employed or retained **including disclosure of whether each lobbyist principal is a government, political party, individual or entity organized in or with its principal place of business located in a country of particular concern as identified by the US Department of State**, and the date of the registration.”

► ERA 2025-07 Modification of Ethics Rule 5.5

Adding provision for Lobbyist disclosure of “Countries of Particular Concern”. Amended to read as follows:

“...Information on the registration shall include the executive lobbyist’s name, business address, including electronic mail address and business telephone numbers, the name and address of each lobbyist principal by whom the lobbyist is employed or retained **including disclosure of whether each lobbyist principal is a government, political party, individual or entity organized in or with its principal place of business located in a country of particular concern as identified by the US Department of State**, the agency or agencies before which the lobbyist is lobbying and the date of the registration....”

Review of committee loans at a specific threshold – Rep. Wilk



➤ **Proposal:** Require review of Loans to Committees at or above \$100,000

Rule 2.67. Loans to Candidate Committees by Candidate and Other Non-Financial Entities.

(A) A loan by any person other than a commercial financial institution to a candidate committee shall be considered a contribution from the lender, guarantor or endorser in the amount of the balance of the loan that has not been repaid.

(B) A candidate may make a loan to his or her candidate committee from his or her personal funds or from joint funds of the candidate and the candidate's spouse. If a candidate makes such a loan to his or her candidate committee, (a) the terms of the loan must be in writing, **signed and dated by all parties involved**, in a document executed contemporaneously with the transfer of funds into the candidate committee's account; **and (b) a copy of the loan document must be provided to the Ethics Commission at the time or within three (3) days of execution.** ~~The document must be signed and dated by all parties involved.~~ Such a loan may be repaid from contributions received by the candidate committee, but the candidate committee shall not be permitted to pay any interest on the loan. **Any candidate that loans \$100,000.00 or more to their candidate committee shall be subject to a formal compliance review to be conducted by the Ethics Commission to determine and verify the source of the funds used for such loan.**

(C) If a candidate transfers his or her personal funds or joint funds of the candidate and the candidate's spouse to the candidate committee without a written loan document, the candidate committee cannot repay the candidate for the transfer.

(D) A candidate who makes expenditures from personal funds or joint funds of the candidate and the candidate's spouse that are not transferred to the candidate committee's account shall not have made a loan to the committee. Such expenditures that are not intended to be reimbursed shall be reported as contributions to and expenditures by the candidate committee, or as in-kind contribution to the candidate committee. Expenditures that are intended to be reimbursed must be reported as in-kind expenditures on the report covering the time period during which the expenditure was made and be reimbursed within ninety (90) days of the expenditure.

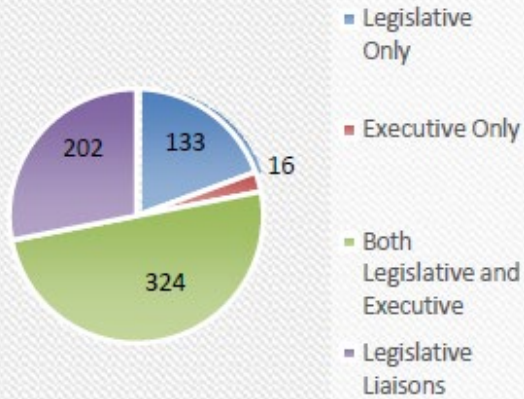

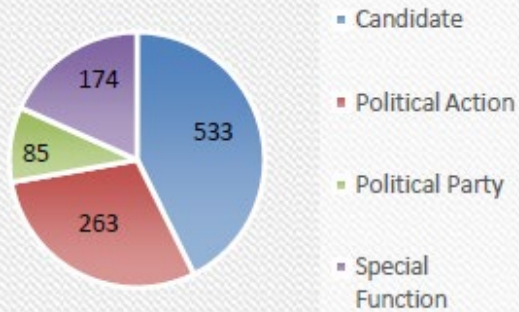

Personal Financial Disclosures: Due May 15, 2026

- As of 5/13/26, almost **95%** of those required to file have already filed their PFDs.
- Of those required to file from the Governor's appointees and Cabinet members, roughly **95%** have filed.

Staff Efforts to reach 100% submission:

- Multiple reminder emails since 4/15
- Compliance officers placing calls to those who have not yet filed once we are within 2 weeks of the final deadline.
- Partnerships with Legislative and Executive Leadership have helped dramatically with reaching full reporting requirements

Current state:

- PDFs are bulk generated and stored locally for analysis
- Analysis progress tracked manually by staff via excel file

Proposed state:

- Monthly/Report based bulk analysis cycle
- Solution queries vendor owned database instead of generated PDF reports
- Web-hosted analytics and workflow dashboard

Deterministic/Programmatic rules flag known issues: No AI, static business rules

AI agent reviews all transactions

- Identifies ambiguity, inconsistencies, and risks and provides score.

Outputs enriched records with flags, risk scores, and reasoning for why it was flagged

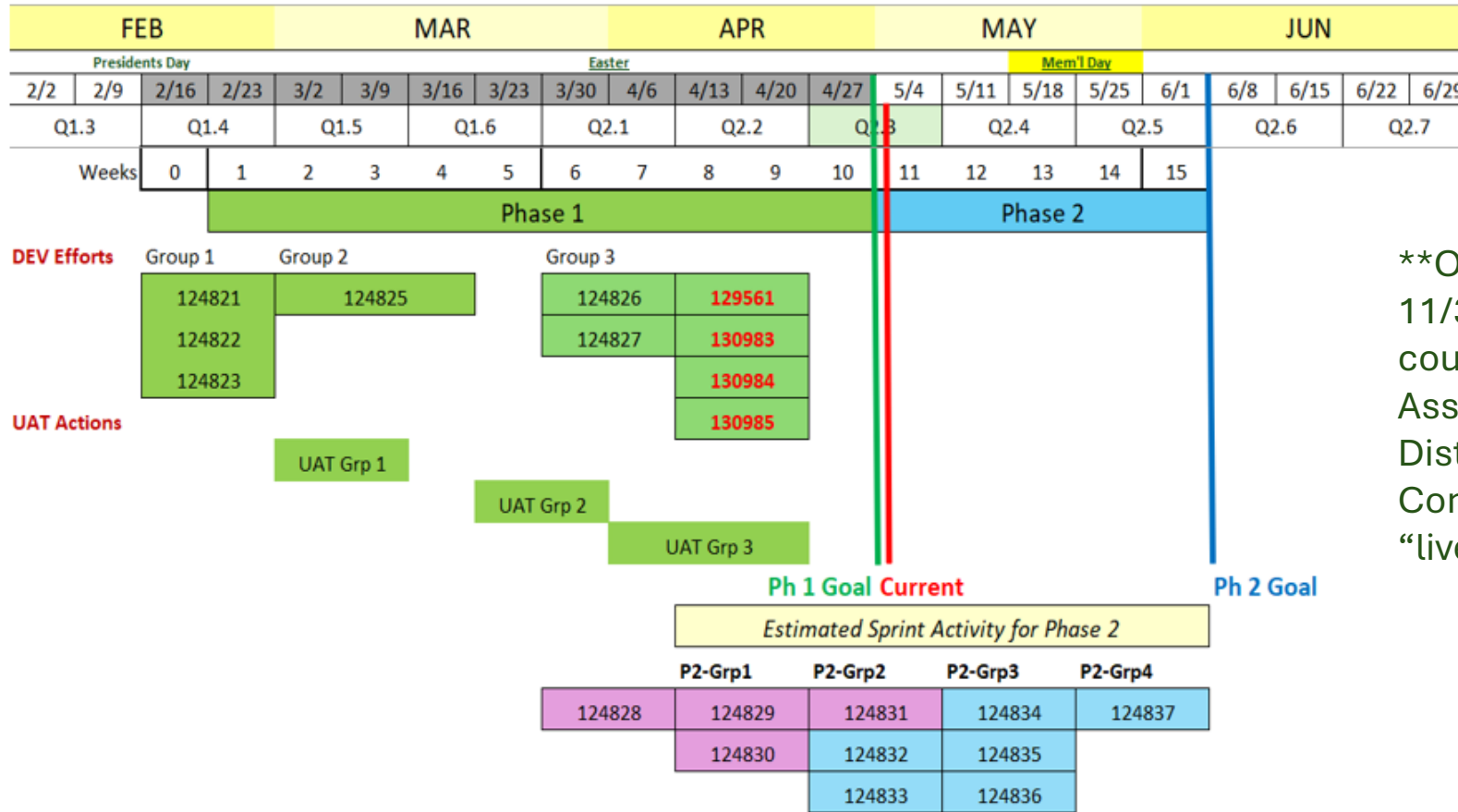

- HB 2164 (2025) Beginning January 1, 2027, every person elected or appointed a chief executive officer or head of a state agency, board, bureau, trust, commission, council, department, system, or authority shall be required within one year after taking the oath of office to attend a course directed by the Oklahoma Ethics Commission.

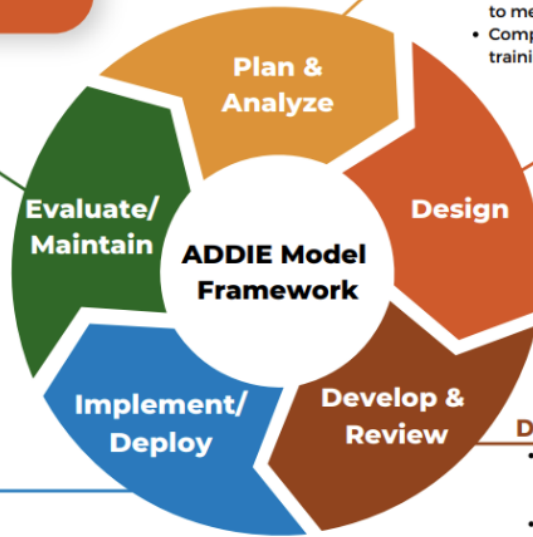
