

Publication of Information in the Public Interest Related to Case Nos. 2022-25, 2025-13 and State of Oklahoma ex rel. Oklahoma Ethics Commission v. Pittman, Oklahoma County District Court, Case No. CJ-2025-____

Ethic Rule 6.9 Confidentiality of Complaint or Investigation.

"Unless the Commission determines that a complaint or a formal investigation should be made public, all complaints and formal investigations, including documents and discussions in executive session, shall remain confidential and shall not be disclosed by a Commissioner, by the Commission or by its employees except to the extent necessary to facilitate or conduct a preliminary inquiry or a formal investigation. However, the Executive Director may confirm or deny the existence of a complaint or formal investigation alleging a violation of these Rules by any individual upon the written request of that individual. A settlement agreement executed under these Rules shall be public record. The Commission may make a complaint or formal investigation and any documents relating thereto public at any time it deems release of that information to be in the public interest."

At the July 10, 2025, Ethics Commission Meeting, the Commission determined that a release of the following information related to Complaint C-25-13 (now Case No. 2025-13), Case No. 2022-25, and *State of Oklahoma ex rel. Oklahoma Ethics Commission v. Pittman*, Oklahoma County District Court, Case No. CJ——— was in the public interest.

In May 2025 Ms. Ajay Pittman (Pittman) failed to meet the terms of the Settlement Agreement in Case No. 2022-25, In re AjayPittman2020, a candidate committee, Anastasia Pittman, as Chair, Naomi Jenkins, Treasurer, Ajay for House99 2022, a candidate committee, Anastasia Pittman, as Candidate, Chair and Treasurer. Specifically, Pittman failed to appropriately tender reimbursement to her campaign fund per the terms of the Settlement and provide proof of such reimbursement to the Commission.

As a result of the breach of the Settlement Agreement in Case No. 2022-25, other reporting inconsistencies have led the Ethics Commission to further audit Pittman's reporting associated with recent Candidate Committees via Complaint C-25-13. The Commission has expanded its investigation, transitioned the complaint to a formal investigation resulting in Case No. 2025-13 and will proceed with all possible remedies available to the Commission in both cases, including enforcement of the Settlement Agreement in Case No. 2022-25 as prescribed and available under the law.
