## Publication of Information in the Public Interest

### Related to Case 2026-13

#### **Ethic Rule 6.9 Confidentiality of Complaint or Investigation.**

“Unless the Commission determines that a complaint or a formal investigation should be made public, all complaints and formal investigations, including documents and discussions in executive session, shall remain confidential and shall not be disclosed[.] ... The Commission may make a complaint or formal investigation and any documents relating thereto public at any time it deems release of that information to be in the public interest.”

At the June 5, 2026 Ethics Commission Meeting, the Commission determined that the following information relative to Case 2026-13 was necessary for the purpose of public transparency and education:

The Commission finds that release of information concerning Case No. 2026-13 is in the public interest pursuant to Ethics Rule 6.9. During the May 14, 2026, Commission meeting, a formal investigation was authorized regarding RoadToVictory2026.com, initially operated by MOGANetwork, LLC.

The complaint alleges that the operators of the website "RoadToVictory2026.com" are soliciting contributions to political candidates by offering participants the opportunity to win a cruise valued at approximately \$1,500. The complaint further alleges that these activities may implicate Rule 2 Campaign Finance provisions of the Ethics Rules governing campaign contributions and related conduct.

Following notice of the complaint, the website was initially taken offline. The Commission has since learned that the website has resumed operations and continues to solicit contributions from members of the public.

Because the website is actively soliciting political contributions while the allegations remain under investigation, and because the conduct at issue could carry significant civil penalties, the Commission finds that prospective contributors, candidates, and the public have a legitimate interest in being informed that these activities are currently the subject of a pending Ethics Commission investigation.

The Commission emphasizes that the allegations have not been adjudicated and that no findings of fact or violations have been made at this time. The release of this information is intended solely to inform the public of the existence of the complaint and ongoing investigation, consistent with the Commission's authority under Rule 6.9.
