

Licensee Statistics Update Mr. Stiles reported a current licensee count prior to the February 2026 meeting was: 98 Apprentices, 1030 Funeral Directors, 17 Funeral Director Assistants, 936 Embalmers, 405 Establishments, and 65 Crematories. For comparison, in April of 2022, there were: 124 Apprentices, 1066 Funeral Directors, 1002 Embalmers, 396 Establishments, and 57 Crematories

2026 Legislative Update-Mr. Stiles reported that staff is tracking various bills including: HB3224, by Rep. Humphrey, repeals the duties and powers of the Funeral Board. HB3260, by Rep. Culver, adds OKFDA as an approver of continuing education classes. HB4322, by Rep. Kendrix, changes the requirements for FDIC and removing the embalmer requirement. SB559, by Sen. Bergstrom, is the casket bill carry over from last session.



**MOTION TO ENFORCE COMPLIANCE WITH CONSENT ORDER AND SECOND
NOTICE OF HEARING**

COMES NOW the State of Oklahoma, ex rel., Oklahoma Funeral Board (“Board”), by and through its attorney of record, Kylie Cooper, Assistant Attorney General, and moves the Board to enforce the Respondents’ compliance with the Consent Order previously granted and to suspend all of the Respondents’ licenses until such time as the Respondents establish to the Board’s satisfaction that they have completely complied. In support of this Motion, the State states:

1. A *Consent Order* regarding Respondents HOPKINS FUNERAL SERVICE LLC, HOPKINS-REYNOLDS FUNERAL SERVICE, and HAROLD WINTON was approved by the Board on April 10, 2025. The Order entered approving the agreed penalty provided in relevant part as follows at pages 11 through 13:

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Oklahoma Funeral Board as follows:

58. The Board en banc hereby adopts the parties' Agreement.

59. Pursuant to this Consent Order, Respondents HOPKINS FUNERAL SERVICE LLC, HOPKINS-REYNOLDS FUNERAL SERVICE, MICHAEL HOPKINS, and HAROLD WINTON agree to the following terms and conditions, which are hereby imposed by the Board:

- a. Respondents agree to jointly pay the Oklahoma Funeral Board an administrative penalty in the amount of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) on or before APRIL 31, 2025.
- b. Respondent Hopkins-Reynolds Funeral Service agrees to a 2-year reporting probation period.
- c. Respondent FDIC Harold Winton must obtain 12 additional hours of continuing education to be completed within the 2025 reporting period.
- d. Should Respondent Michael Hopkins apply for and be granted a license, he agrees to a probation period of 1 year.
- e. Respondents agree to pay Restitution in the following amounts:
 - i. In Complaint No. 24-46:
 1. \$766.50 payable to the family of Sandra D. Bradley.
 - ii. In Compliant No. 24-49:
 1. \$1,146.50 payable to the family of Russell Williams.

iii. In Complaint No. 25-10:

1. \$659.00 payable to the family of Joshua Greene.
2. \$1,350.00 payable to the family of Youree Holloway.
3. \$791.50 payable to the family of Jamie Pride.
4. \$766.50 payable to the family of John Davidson.
5. \$591.50 payable to the family of Sylvia Cox.

iv. In Complaint No. 25-11:

1. \$35,255.00 payable to Southern Heritage

v. In Complaint No. 25-19:

1. \$20,968.54 payable to Oklahoma Mortuary Service Tulsa.

These Restitution amounts shall be paid pursuant to the terms of a payment plan between the Respondents and the Board.

f. Respondents agree that should any required payment be missed, an additional penalty of \$50 dollars per day will be imposed, and that penalty amount shall be paid with the underlying outstanding amount. For purposes of this Order, payment by mailed check shall be considered timely if: 1) the envelope containing the payment check is postmarked on or before the day the scheduled payment is due, and; 2) the enclosed check is valid and able to be cashed by the Board. The \$50 penalty described above shall accrue on days the Funeral Board offices are open and able to accept a payment.

60. As authorized by law, Respondents shall jointly pay a total of two thousand (\$2,000.00) towards the costs of this action, including prosecution and investigation costs pursuant to 59 O.S. §396.12e(B). Said sum shall be paid in full on or before APRIL 31, 2025. Should Respondents violate this Consent Order, the Board shall hold a hearing regarding the alleged

violation. The violation of any term(s) of this Consent Order may result in further disciplinary action, including, but not limited to, revocation of Respondents' licenses or certifications. Therefore, the Board retains jurisdiction over this proceeding until all matters are finally resolved as set forth in this Consent Order.

2. To date, Respondents have only made payment in the amount of \$9,500.00 to the Oklahoma Funeral Board. There have been no Restitution payments made, in violation of said Consent Order.

WHEREFORE, the State requests that the Board enforce the Consent Order and suspend all of the Respondents' licenses or any other remedies that they deem fit, until the Consent Order is fully complied with, and that the costs of the enforcement proceedings be assessed against the Respondents.

SECOND NOTICE OF HEARING

In accordance with the jurisdiction granted this tribunal in 59 O.S. §396.2a(7), (9) and §396.12c, an evidentiary hearing will be commenced on **Thursday, March 12, 2026, at 10:00am in the 1st Floor Conference Room of the Office of Chief Medical Examiner, 921 N.E. 23rd Street, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma 73105**. If it be the decision of the Board, after considering all of the evidence presented, that the Respondent is in violation of any of the above-referenced law, the Board may take whatever appropriate action that is provided for in its rules and statutes. 



COMPLAINT AND NOTICE OF HEARING

The State of Oklahoma, *ex rel.*, Oklahoma Funeral Board ("Board"), by and through Assistant Attorney General Kylie Cooper, files this Complaint and Notice of Hearing, alleging that the Respondents, HOPKINS-REYNOLDS FUNERAL SERVICE, HOPKINS FUNERAL SERVICE LLC and HAROLD WINTON, have violated provisions of the State Funeral Services Licensing Act, 59 O.S. § 395.1 *et seq.* (the "Act"), and Rules of the Board, Oklahoma Administrative Code ("O.A.C.") Section 235:10-1-1 *et seq.* (the "Rules"), in the manner set forth below:

JURISDICTION

1. Respondent HOPKINS FUNERAL SERVICE LLC (“Funeral Home”) is licensed by the Board, establishment license number 2024ES, and is located at 1501 W Main St, Collinsville, OK 74021.
2. Respondent HAROLD WINTON (“Funeral Director in Charge” or “FDIC”) is licensed by the Board as a funeral director and embalmer, license numbers 1692FD and 1980EM, and at all relevant times was the Funeral Director in Charge at Funeral Home and registered agent for Respondent HOPKINS FUNERAL SERVICE LLC.
3. Respondent HOPKINS-REYNOLDS FUNERAL SERVICE (“Owner”) is, and at all relevant times was, the owner of record for Funeral Home. Upon information and belief, Respondent HAROLD WINTON is the registered agent for Respondent HOPKINS-REYNOLDS FUNERAL SERVICE.
4. The Board has jurisdiction over Respondents pursuant to 59 O.S. §§ 396.2a(9) and (11). *See also* 59 O.S. §396.12f(F).

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

5. On or about July 7, 2025, Board staff received a complaint from a consumer regarding the cremation of her husband. At the time of the complaint, the consumer had still not received the cremated remains or death certificates.
6. Further, Board Staff investigated and discovered that the decedent dies on June 2, 2025, and the Medical Examiner’s office started the case in ROVER on June 3, 2025. On June 4, the Funeral Home entered some of the decedent’s personal information, but failed to register the cremation permit. The cremation was not completed until July 21, 2025.
7. Further, the complaint alleged that Respondents had failed to file a death certificate, cremation permit, disinterment permit or any other necessary permit as required by law in a

timely manner, in violation of OAC 235: 10-7-2(14). The Board provided Respondents with the Notice of Complaint via certified mail on July 8, 2025.

8. On July 17, 2025, Respondents filed their response to Complaint No. 26-01 with the Board. Respondents stated that the reason the death certificates had yet to be received was because Vital Records was behind.

9. By public vote during the meeting on October 9, 2025, the Board found probable cause to file a formal complaint against Respondents for the violation alleged herein.

10. The prosecution has sufficient evidence which, if presented to the Board at an evidentiary hearing, would constitute clear and convincing evidence of the alleged violations.

ALLEGED CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

11. Respondents violated OAC 235: 10-7-2(14) by failing to file necessary permits as required by law in a timely fashion. The relevant Board rule, 235: 10-7-2(14), provides:

Failure to file a death certificate, cremation permit, disinterment permit or any other necessary permit as required by law in a timely manner.

12. FDIC is “responsible for the legal and ethical operation of the [Funeral Home] and is accountable to the Board.” 59 O.S. §396.2(12). Therefore, Respondent HAROLD WINTON as the Funeral Director in Charge of the Funeral Home is also liable for the above violations.

13. Due to the above violations, Respondents are subject to disciplinary action by the Board. *See* 59 O.S. §§ 396.2a(9) and (11); *id.* at §§ 396.12c(A)(5) and (8); *id.* at § 396.12d; *id.* at § 396.12e.

AUTHORIZED PENALTIES

14. The Board is authorized to impose any of the following penalties for violations of the Act or Rules: (1) denial, revocation, suspension, or nonrenewal of license or certificate of apprenticeship; (2) administrative fines up to ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) per series of related

violations¹; (3) injunctive proceedings; and (4) other disciplinary action. 59 O.S. §§ 396.12c(5) and (8); *id.* at § 396.12c; *id.* at § 396.12d; *id.* at § 396.12e.

15. Further, the Board is authorized to “impose... as a condition of any adverse disciplinary action, the payment of costs expended by the Board in investigating and prosecuting the violation.” 59 O.S. § 396.12e(B). Costs may include, but are not limited to, “staff time, salary and travel expenses, [and] witness fees and attorney fees.” *Id.*

16. In lieu of prosecution, Respondents “may elect to surrender the license.” *Id.* at § 396.12e(D). However, should Respondents surrender their licenses, they “shall be forever barred from obtaining a reissuance of said license or certificate of apprenticeship.” *Id.*

NOTICE OF HEARING

An **EVIDENTIARY HEARING** will be held before the Board on **MARCH 12, 2026 at 10:00 A.M.** Respondents may appear personally or through an attorney. If Respondents fail to appear, the hearing will be held in their absence. Respondents have the right to submit a written response, cross-examine witnesses, and present evidence on their behalf. *See* 75 O.S. §§ 309 and 310. If the Board decides, after considering all the evidence presented, that Respondents are in violation of any of the above-referenced laws, the Board may take any authorized disciplinary action it deems appropriate.

Instead of proceeding with the aforementioned hearing, the parties may present a **JOINT**

¹ When determining the amount of an administrative penalty, the Board shall consider, but not be limited to:

the nature, circumstances and gravity of the violation and, with respect to the person or entity found to have committed the violation, the degree of culpability, the effect on ability of the person or entity to continue to do business and any show of good faith in attempting to achieve compliance with the provisions of the Funeral Services Licensing Act.

PROPOSED CONSENT ORDER to the Board on the same date and time. *See* 75 O.S. § 309(E).





COMPLAINT AND NOTICE OF HEARING

The State of Oklahoma, ex rel., Oklahoma Funeral Board ("Board"), by and through Assistant Attorneys General Joseph Ashbaker and Kylie Cooper, files this Complaint and Notice of Hearing, alleging that the Respondents, ALPHA & OMEGA MORTUARY SERVICE & CREMATORY, STILLWELL LIMITED INC, and HEATHER SQUIRES, have violated provisions of the State Funeral Services Licensing Act, 59 O.S. § 395.1 et seq. (the "Act"), and Rules of the Board, Oklahoma Administrative Code ("O.A.C.") Section 235:10-1-1 et seq. (the "Rules"), in the manner set forth below:

I. JURISDICTION

1. Respondent ALPHA & OMEGA MORTUARY SERVICE & CREMATORY (“Alpha”) is licensed by the Board, establishment license number 2015CE, and is located at 4040 North Stiles, Oklahoma City, OK 73105.
2. Respondent HEATHER SQUIRES (“Funeral Director in Charge” or “FDIC”) is licensed by the Board as a funeral director and embalmer, license numbers 2963FD and 3345EM, and at all relevant times was the Funeral Director in Charge at the Commercial Embalming Establishment.
3. Respondent STILLWELL LIMITED, INC. (“Stillwell”) is, and at all relevant times was, the owner of record for Commercial Embalming Establishment. Upon information and belief, Respondent HEATHER SQUIRES is the registered agent for Respondent ALPHA & OMEGA MORTUARY SERVICE & CREMATORY.
4. The Board has jurisdiction over Respondents pursuant to 59 O.S. §§ 396.2a(9) and (11). *See also* 59 O.S. § 396.12f(F).

II. ALLEGATIONS OF UNPROFESSIONAL CONDUCT

1. This case was initiated by a complaint received by Board staff on or about August 16, 2024, filed by a customer. The customer alleged in the complaint that when the customer went to pick up her infant daughter’s cremains, the decedent had not been cremated and was returned to the customer in a blanket.
2. Board staff provided Respondents with notice of the complaint via email on August 19, 2024.
3. Customer requested the remains of her daughter be cremated and signed the cremation authorization and statement of services with Brown’s Funeral Services, Inc. (“Browns”). Brown’s contacted Alpha and requested that they pick up the remains and conduct the cremation. Alpha agreed and picked up the remains from the Oklahoma Medical Examiner.
4. According to Alpha, the remains of Customers daughter were cremated on December 7, 2023.
5. Employees of Brown’s picked up the purported cremains and personal effects of the decedent and brought them to Brown’s Funeral Home where they remained. There was an urn marked with the decedent’s name and a bag with what was purportedly personal effects in the form of blankets. In fact, the remains of the decedent were not cremated, but left in the bag of personal effects and returned to Customer. Customer subsequently discovered the untagged, un-embalmed and un-cremated remains in the bag of purported personal effects.

III. VIOLATIONS

6. Based on the foregoing, the Respondents are guilty of unprofessional conduct for violation of the following Oklahoma statutes and administrative rules:
- a. Gross malpractice or gross incompetency, which shall be determined by the Board in violation of Title 59 § 396.12c(A)(3):
 - b. Violation of any of the provisions of the Funeral Services Licensing Act or any violation of Sections 201 through 231 of Title 8 of the Oklahoma Statutes in violation of Title 59 § 396.12c(A)(5):
 - c. Each funeral establishment which offers or performs cremations shall maintain an identification system that ensures the ability of the funeral establishment to identify the human remains in its possession throughout all phases of the cremation process. Upon completion of the cremation process, the crematory operator shall attest to the identity of the cremated remains and the date, time, and place the cremation process occurred on a form prescribed by rule of the Oklahoma Funeral Board. The form shall accompany the human remains in all phases of transportation, cremation, and return of the cremated remains in violation of Title 59 § 396.29(E):
 - d. Desecration. Damage, abuse, desecration or the unauthorized removal of tissue, bones, or organs of any human remains in the custody of a licensed funeral service establishment, commercial embalming establishment, crematory, funeral director, embalmer, or apprentice. Desecration shall not include the removal of blood, body fluids, body tissue, or other body parts in the normal course of embalming or restoration requested by authorizing agent. Desecration also includes the simultaneous cremation of more than one human dead body without express written approval of the authorizing agent, cremating human remains without the permit requires by 63 O.S. §1-329 or cremating dead human remains without express written approval of the authorizing agent in violation of OAC 235:10-7-2(10):
 - e. Disposal within 24 hours. Un-embalmed dead human bodies shall be legally disposed of within 24 hours after death unless the body is placed in a designated body refrigeration chamber which maintains a constant temperature of 40 degrees Fahrenheit or less. The body shall remain in the refrigerated area until such time as legal disposition is to occur. Once removed from refrigeration, either embalming or disposition shall occur within eight hours of said removal in violation of OAC 235:10-11-1(13):
 - f. A non-detachable bracelet attached at all times to the human remains shall identify each human remains in the possession or custody of the funeral establishment, commercial embalming establishment, or crematory in this state in violation of OAC 235:10-11-1(d)(4)(A) & OAC 235:10-14-1(k)(1):
 - g. Un-embalmed human remains awaiting cremation must be placed in refrigerated storage at 40 degrees Fahrenheit or less in violation of OAC 235:10-14-1(a):

- h. From receiving through storage, cremation, processing, packaging and release, proper identification must accompany the remains at all times in violation of OAC 235:10-14-1(b);

CONCLUSION

Given the foregoing, the undersigned requests the Board conduct a hearing, and, upon proof of the allegations contained herein, impose such disciplinary action as authorized by law, up to and including suspension or revocation and any other appropriate action with respect to the Respondent's professional license, including an assessment of costs and attorney fees incurred in this action as provided by law.


