

Consumer Health

The Consumer Health Division works to prevent and control the spread of disease in Cleveland County.

-Inspections are of the following:

- Eating and drinking establishments
- Retail food (e.g. grocery stores)
- Food service (schools, day cares, & other facilities)
- Public bathing facilities (swimming pools, spas)
- Athletic and special events

-Investigations and consultations for:

- Potential rabies exposure
- Food borne outbreaks and reportable diseases

-Technical Services:

- Plan review for food establishments (online applications and in person applications available)
- Food handlers cards via online instruction and testing

Emergency Preparedness

Emergency Preparedness and Response Service works with the county and local communities in planning, organizing and coordinating programs related to public health and medical system disaster response and recovery operations in Cleveland County.

Health Educators

Health Educators promote and encourage healthy behaviors by informing and educating schools, businesses, and local communities about current important health issues. They host meetings and classes offering the latest information on sexual health and puberty, nutrition, dental hygiene and general health. They also offer car seat checks/installations by certified car seat technicians.

Community Health Workers

Community health workers serve as a trusted bridge between Cleveland County residents and the vital healthcare and social services they need. By networking with local affiliates, they gather up-to-date information on housing, food, utility, and medical assistance to help community members navigate complex systems. They actively participate in local health fairs and outreach events, offering wellness education and connecting individuals to life-improving resources.

Women, Infants, & Children (WIC)

WIC is a supplemental Nutrition program for Women, Infants, and Children. WIC provides services by appointment to women who are pregnant, breastfeeding, or recently given birth, and infants and children up to age 5 who meet eligibility guidelines. WIC also offers nutrition and breastfeeding education.

Children First

Children First is a no cost family support and home visitation program. Registered nurses are specially trained in prenatal, infant, and toddler care to assist families who are first-time parents, prior to 29 weeks to age two based on eligibility. Children first also offers developmental screenings and referrals.

SoonerStart

SoonerStart is designed to help parents and caregivers with infants and toddlers from birth through 36 months of age who have developmental delays. SoonerStart can help parents learn how to enhance a child's development with daily routines such as playtime, mealtime, or bedtime. SoonerStart also offers speech language services, occupational, recreational and physical therapy and counseling services.

Child Guidance

Child Guidance serves families with children ages 18 and under to prevent problems and help families grow and develop together. Child Guidance offers consultations with parents, childcare workers, teachers and community organizations about child development and behavior. Speech language evaluations and treatment are also offered. Child Guidance can also screen for Autism.

General Clinic

General preventative clinical needs are provided to the public.

Services by **walk-in** include:

- Emergency Tetanus
- Emergency Contraception

Services by **appointment only** include:

- Flu vaccine
- Adult and childhood immunizations (Some fees may apply)
- Sexually Transmitted Infection (STI) testing, treatment, & follow-up
- Tuberculosis screening & treatment
- HIV testing, counseling, & referral
- Hepatitis C testing & referral
- Newborn screening
- Audiology Newborn Hearing Screening
- Head lice checks

Family Planning

Family Planning provides clinical and counseling services. Fees for service are based on family size and income.

Services by **appointment only** include:

- Annual exams for individuals of childbearing status
 - We cannot see clients who have had a hysterectomy, tubal ligation or have been through menopause
- Birth control
- Pregnancy testing and counseling
- Sexually Transmitted Infection & Disease (STI/STD) testing and treatment
- Smoking cessation referrals
