Immunizations

A variety of immunizations are available for infants, children and adults; most at no cost.

We provide immunizations required for school attendance and childcare centers in Oklahoma, as well as immunization training and consultation for providers.

SERVICES

- **Birth & Death Certificates** - to order, visit Vr.health.ok.gov
- **Children First** (a voluntary home visitation program for first time moms that are less than 29 weeks and meet income eligibility)
- **Community Engagement** (includes Community Health Worker services and outreach)
- **Consumer Protection** (restaurant, food, swimming pool, school, hotel/motel inspections)
- **Health Education** (no cost community health presentations, disease prevention education, car seat checks)
- **Medicaid Eligibility Checks**
- **Mobile Wellness Unit** (find mobile wellness unit events in the community by visiting: Oklahoma.gov/health/mobilewellness)
- **Head Checks** (head lice control)
- **SoonerStart** (early intervention program that provides screenings, assessments, specialized services and therapy for infants and toddlers up to age 3)
- **Language Line Availability** (Phone interpreter services available)
- **Tobacco Prevention** (guidance and resources to quit smoking)
- **Voter Registration** (voter applications available at the county health department)

Oklahoma Women, Infants & Children Program (WIC)

WIC is a nutrition education and supplemental food program for pregnant women, postpartum breastfeeding and nonbreastfeeding women and their infants and children who meet program eligibility requirements.

Program benefits include:

- Nutritious Foods
- Nutrition Education Classes
- Breastfeeding Support
- Consultations with Registered/Licensed Dietitians and Lactation Specialist

Family Planning

The Family Planning program provides the means and opportunity for clients to determine the number and spacing of their children, and to make informed decisions regarding being healthy.

Family Planning services include:

- Annual exams
- Family planning education
- Health education
- Fertility counseling
- Birth control (including long-acting reversible contraceptives)
- STI/STD checks
- Pregnancy testing

STI/STD Services

Confidential testing, evaluation, health education, treatment, and referrals are offered for a variety of sexually transmitted infections and diseases.
