By using this resource you are not only impacting the oral health of your residents, but their overall health, as well. It is important to include annual oral care training for your staff and new employees. We have collected useful links for you to use when training your staff about oral health care for nursing home residents and the elderly.

The purpose of OK Senior Smiles is to educate nursing home staff on the importance of daily oral hygiene and the impact oral health has on one's overall health. As the elderly population retaining more of their natural teeth continues to grow at a rapid rate, the importance of oral health needs to be stressed and encouraged. Approximately 1 in 10 cases of pneumonia in nursing home residents is caused by aspirational pneumonia, or the inhalation of bacteria from the mouth. Poor oral health is also connected to heart disease and endothelial dysfunction, the non-obstructive coronary artery disease. Additionally, if your residents have diabetes, they may be at increased risk for developing gum disease. Good oral hygiene can help mitigate these risks, as well as improve pain, social interactions, depression and the overall health of nursing home residents.¹
