Colorectal Cancer Data Presentation: Presented by Raffaella Espinoza

- 5 Year Survival Rate of Colorectal Cancer by stage, United States: the localized patient had highest 5 year survival rate.
- CRC screening recommendation, in 2019, is for age 50-75.
- Age-Adjusted Incidence Rate of Colorectal Cancer by Race/Ethnicity and Gender: Male and Female Non-Hispanic American Indian had greatest incident rate from others.
- For Age-Adjusted Mortality Rate of Colorectal Cancer by Race/Ethnicity and Gender, Oklahoma, 2013-2017 indicated that Male Non-Hispanic Black and American Indian were highest in others.

CRC Task force and Upcoming changes to Colorectal Campaign :

CRC Task force separate in many task group to

- Start focusing in the Central Oklahoma area.
- is made up of representatives from major health systems with the common goal of addressing continuity of care.
- Focus on improving the rate of screening; increasing access to care, process navigation, and awareness and education for both providers and patients; and decreasing mortality rates.

- Oklahoma was ranked last place in the country for screening cancer.
- The meeting is scheduled once a month, attendees are welcomed to attend. Next meeting is on March 21, 2019 at 3-5 p.m. at ASC office: 6525 N Meridian Ave., OKC, OK.
- Informed the members of the upcoming the watch party “80% colorectal cancer screening rate in every community” live from Atlanta, GA is on in March 7, 2019. at American Cancer Society office at 1-2 p.m. The goal for the campaign is to reach at least 80% of patient in every community to receive colorectal cancer screening rate by 2018. In 2019, the American Cancer Society and National Colorectal Cancer Roundtable have made progress on the campaign.
