## TITLE 310. OKLAHOMA STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH CHAPTER 616. BIRTHING CENTERS REGULATIONS [REVOKED]

## 1. **DESCRIPTION:**

SB1739 removed Licensure requirements for birthing centers and Department authority to license. This legislation did not remove Hospital licensure requirements, under 63 O.S. §1-701 et seq.

## 2. <u>DESCRIPTION OF PERSONS AFFECTED AND COST IMPACT RESPONSE:</u>

Prior to the law change, there were no standalone licensed birthing centers licensed in the state of Oklahoma. There are no anticipated cost impacts or people affected by this statute and subsequent rule change.
