PROPOSED RULES:

Chapter 669. Trauma Care Assistance Revolving Fund [AMENDED]

SUMMARY:

The proposed amendments update statutory citations and remove a typographical scrivener's error.

AUTHORITY:

Commissioner of Health, Title 63 O.S. §§ 1-104 and 1-2530.9.

COMMENT PERIOD:

The alternate date and time in the event of an office closure due to inclement weather is February 21, 2023 in the Auditorium, from 9:30 AM to 12:30 PM. Those wishing to present oral comments should be present at that time to register to speak. The hearing will close at the conclusion of those registering to speak. Interested persons may attend for the purpose of submitting data, views or concerns, orally or in writing, about the rule proposal described and summarized in this Notice. Validated parking will be provided for the parking lot located at the east corner of Broadway and Robert S. Kerr Avenue, subject to availability.
