

Urinary Tract Infections: Treatment Pathway

Recommended path for assessment and treatment of urinary tract infections based on IDSA guideline recommendations.




IV or PO

If coverage is appropriate and patient can take PO it is the preferred route

Follow Up

Assess for resolution of symptoms



Urinary Symptoms
Altered mental status

Increased urinary frequency

Dysuria

 Duration can be extended 5 to 7 depending on complexity
 Male gender, stone or other

it can be treated as simple UTI

obstruction, etc. • Pyelonephritis should be treated for 7 to 10 days

Asymptomatic Bacteriuria

Most often represents colonization and should NOT be treated
Only treat select patient groups (e.g. pregnant women)
