

• Quality Improvement Committee:


- Trauma Rotation Committee:

- Regional Planning Committee:

David Howerton asked Zakia Yazdanipour if she would like to let the committee know what happened in the RPC this morning being Brad was unable to make it. The committee had interesting discussion about the bylaws. The committee made a motion to add to their next agenda to review the bylaws along with the state statute just to make sure we are actually meeting the requirements. The way our RTAB has grown we are actually exceeding what the bylaws state we can have. That is why we really need to look at them. We are a very large systems and we want to make sure we are meeting the requirements. David Howerton stated he will address this later in the meeting.

Regional Medical Response System

Zakia Yazdanipour reported they were rather busy during the month of June and early July. We had several large events happening in our area that were threats to our medical systems and want to thank everybody to actually stepping up and being ready to respond to those events.

We had the Oklahoma City Memorial Marathon which was the 25th anniversary of the marathon and the 30th anniversary of the bombing. Both of those events were very large with President Clinton attending the memorial. The marathon had the largest registration they have ever had at 25,756 passes. Due to bad weather we had to cancel the Saturday events and incorporate the 5K run into the Sunday event which affected Saints but was able to adapt and overcome the situation. Out of the 25,000 we had 1300 medical contacts along the race route. We had the college world series which again set record attendance. The LA 28 group came down to watch how we handled the event because in 2028 we will have Olympic softball as well as the canoe slalom. They came back to observe how we handled the Thunder finals. They did not stick around for the parade. So, we had a president setting event downtown with

about 600,00 folks in a 1.7-mile route. She thanked OU Health enough for taking on the task with the med tents. We would not have been able to handle what we did that day without those tents. We had roughly 1300 medical contacts that day also. For that number of people in the middle of June to have 1300 contacts is good. That speaks to the comradery and partnership of this medical system. We could not have done it without you.

Grant wise we are starting a brand-new budget period, and I know we mentioned in the last meeting we threatened with a 50% grant cut we have been announced a 30% cut. So, all the RMRS have to revise our budget and figure out how we are going to maintain the system we provide. We are looking very closely at where we can make those cuts and maintain the need of our healthcare coalition.

Region 8 Prehospital Trauma Transports Data Report
 Chairperson David Howerton asked the group if they want to talk about their data. Mr.
 Zachery Sinsheimer stated everybody got their data into David in a timely manner. With what I saw everything pretty much stayed the same. The good news is that with all the activity we did not stir up a very large percentage change in trauma.

The data work group committee has been meeting and putting together, and we have a draft template we should be able distribute for trial in the third quarter and go live in the fourth quarter. We also have a date set for a data boot camp for all EMS agencies, Fire agencies and health care system partners. It does not matter which data you pull up they are all about the same with the exception of SSM Midwest EMS might go to SSM Saints. You can look at the rest and the distribution of patients is about the same.

David Howerton asked if they have a plan to come up with a total graph?

Jason Likens states it will be a composite. Jason states he would like everyone to come to the boot camp. This is a composite of 8 different EMS agencies and 27 hospital facilities. The end result is to create a composite of the system of one systems set of data. We are then working off one sheet of music.

David Howerton said this is great because in the we don't share data between hospitals and agencies. For years we have only been looking at one agencies set of numbers. He asked SSM Midwest EMS if the priority one patients taken to SSM midtown transferred out to OU or Baptist after arriving at SSM downtown. The answer was the only ones that would be transferred out would probably be neuro patients. They also advise they audit100% of transfers.

Dr. David Smith asked for data integrity if there are any cavoites to the data to the nonparticipants or data you feel are outside the data set we need be aware of interpreting the data. Zachary stated the initial set is going to be trimmed down from what you see from the agencies. It will be destinations and impression to start with, because the way it breaks down is six pages per agency. Once we get that down we might be able to get that into OKEMSIS high level training. That is the eventual goal. We are starting small so we can get all the key elements. Dr. Smith asked will everyone be able to get to the data. Zachery states there will be a dashboard. Dr. Smith asked if the contributing agencies are region 8. Zachery stated 6 & 8 currently. Dr. Smith mentioned way back when the trauma evaluations at the state that were
