1. Bat Rabies Prevention Mike Manell

- Mike is the Assistant Director for Infectious Disease Prevention and Response (IDPR)
- Rabies is a viral disease that infects the nervous system of humans and warm-blooded mammals and is considered 100% fatal if left untreated
- The treatment for rabies is post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP); a series of shots over 14 days. Once symptoms develop, there is no effective treatment
- Bats can gain entry to a space through openings as small as 1/4 inch and will return to their maternal roost if entry is available
- High risk categories for exposures: (You may not feel the bite)
 - Sleeping
 - Heavily medicated or intoxicated
 - Non-verbal or mentally incapacitated
- When bats are found, do not release the bat, capture it for testing and call the IDPR epidemiologist-on-call for guidance

2. COVID-19 FAQs Rhonda McComas

- Rhonda is the Lead Long Term Care Infection Preventionist with Infectious Disease Prevention and Response
- Flu season
 - o OSDH <u>Viral View (oklahoma.gov)</u> provides up to date surveillance data for Influenza, COVID, and RSV
 - o Flu, COVID-19, and RSV have the potential to co-circulate. Double check and don't forget there may be need to test for both
- Current COVID CDC Recommendations
 - o New CDC webpage Infection Control Guidance: SARS-CoV-2 | COVID-19 | CDC
 - o Definition has not changed ONE POSTIVE COVID-19 resident or staff member begins your facility's outbreak response.
 - o Outbreak Testing Process Contact Tracing and Broad-Based Testing
 - Duration of isolation removal of resident from Transmission-Based Precautions (TBP) and staff Return to Work (RTW)
 - Guidance for managing staff with infection or exposure and the staff RTW criteria can be found in Interim Guidance for Managing Healthcare Personnel with SARS-CoV-2 Infection or Exposure to SARS-CoV-2 | COVID-19 | CDC

3. Form 283 Reminders Philip Miller

- Philip is the Director of Long Term Services
- Form 283 Reminders
 - o Continuum of Care Facilities- ensure to document correct Facility ID (example: CC1234 vs CC1234AL)
 - Ensure correct Facility ID, especially with facilities with similar names, or facilities that are part of the same company (example Cottage #1 has ID: NH1234, Cottage #2 has ID: NH1235)
 - Ensure to document resident name(s) and staff name(s) if applicable
 - o Ensure to include relative history, resident physical and/or psychosocial outcomes, and protective measures on initial incident report
 - Form 283 was revised in July 2024. Please discard any older forms you may be using and begin using the revised version located at ltc-form-odh-283-fillable-incident-report-form.pdf (oklahoma.gov)
- Assisted Living COVID-19 Guidance
 - Guidance for Assisted Living comes from CDC guidance and is considered the standard of care related to infection control for COVID-19
 - o This guidance can be found on the webpage Infection Control Guidance: SARS-CoV-2 | COVID-19 | CDC



- o This guidance is designed using the CDC Core Infection Prevention and Control Practices (IPC)
- o Consider what is happening in your facility and in the community. Monitor the COVID Hospital Admissions of your county on the CDC COVID Data Tracker
- The CDC has been the standard of care over the last four years for COVID-19, and assisted living facilities are expected to follow the standards
- o If you are following another standard, you need to be able to show what that standard is, what the resource documentation is and how you meet those standards
- Guidance for long-term care settings whose staff only provide non-skilled personal care can be found at <u>Preventing Respiratory</u>
 Viruses | Respiratory Illnesses | CDC
- The guidance is also designed using the CDC Core Infection Prevention and Control Practices (IPC)
- o This guidance is for preventing respiratory viruses including COVID, flu and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV)
- Facilities should base decisions to follow this guidance using the COVID-19 hospital admission levels
- This guidance still recommends the Core Practices of:
 - Stay up to date with immunizations
 - Practice good hygiene (practices that improve cleanliness)
 - Take steps for cleaner air
 - Masking
 - Physical distancing
 - Testing
