New DRAFT item sets

A new DRAFT version of the 2020 MDS item sets (v1.18.0) scheduled to become effective October 1, 2020 and the DRAFT version of the MDS 3.0 Item Set Change History for October 2020 (v1.18.0) was posted on CMS [website](#). These files are located in the Downloads section at the bottom of the page. Please note that Section G has been removed from all Federal item sets.

Upcoming Revisions to Nursing Home Compare

CMS announced plans to launch a simplified and consistent online experience to make it easier for consumers to find and compare care. CMS plans to combine and standardize the current eight existing Compare tools, under the new "Medicare Care Compare". CMS's goal is to provide a unified experience so consumers will be able to easily find the information that is most important to help make health care decisions, like getting quality data by the type of health care provider. CMS stated these revisions are anticipated to occur this spring when they will kick off a transition period that allows the public to use the revised tools alongside the existing tools before they are retired.

Update: Local Contact Agency Information

Nursing homes are required to make a referral to the Local Contact Agency when a resident expresses a desire to speak to someone about returning to the community, as instructed in Section Q of the MDS. This requirement is following the resident's civil rights and is considered a violation of the individual's rights if not done.
