TITLE 540. HEALTH CARE WORKFORCE TRAINING COMMISSION CHAPTER 55. HEALTH CARE WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT GRANT PROGRAM

A. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PURPOSE OF PROPOSED RULES:

The Health Care Workforce Training Commission proposes new rules that establish initial guidelines for administration of the Health Care Workforce Development Grant Program. This program will distribute over \$75,000,000 in federal American Rescue Plan Act ("ARPA") money to select subrecipients for 27 specific health care workforce projects, including, among other things, capital improvements to nursing schools, as designated by the Oklahoma Legislature.

These changes have no fiscal impact to the agency budget outside of the appropriated federal funds for this program.

B. CLASS OF PERSON(S) AFFECTED (CLASS BEARING COST OF RULES):

At this point in time, the agency does not anticipate any cost impacts related to the grant program that are not completely paid for by federal funding, and has not received any information from private or public entities indicating otherwise.

C. CLASS OF PERSON(S) BENEFITED BY PROPOSED RULES:

These rules are to provide the agency and its subrecipients direction and a defined process to fulfill the intent of the grant program, in compliance with state and federal law.

D. DESCRIPTION OF ECONOMIC IMPACT UPON AFFECTED CLASSES OF PERSONS OR POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS

These new rules will not financially impact the agency's current budget or the State of Oklahoma. There are no fees or fee changes associated with these rule changes.

The agency does not anticipate any additional costs, not legislatively provided to the agency, to implement and administer the Health Care Workforce Development Grant program.
