# Expensive Energy Hurts the Poor

*The Two Hundred, et al. v. California Air Resources Board*

“California’s climate change policies... have caused and will cause **unconstitutional and unlawful disparate impacts** to California’s minority populations.”

“The ‘net zero’ GHG threshold would operate unconstitutionally so as to **disproportionately disadvantage low-income minorities** in need of affordable housing relative to wealthier, whiter homeowners who currently occupy the limited existing housing stock...”

# The U.S. is a World Leader in Clean Air



- We've reduced criteria pollutants by 77% since 1970.
- Recent shutdowns show just how clean our air is. In most cities, air quality did not meaningfully improve (and in some, it actually worsened).

- A proposed DOL rule would require fiduciaries to choose investments solely on financial criteria, but this movement must also be fought at the state level.



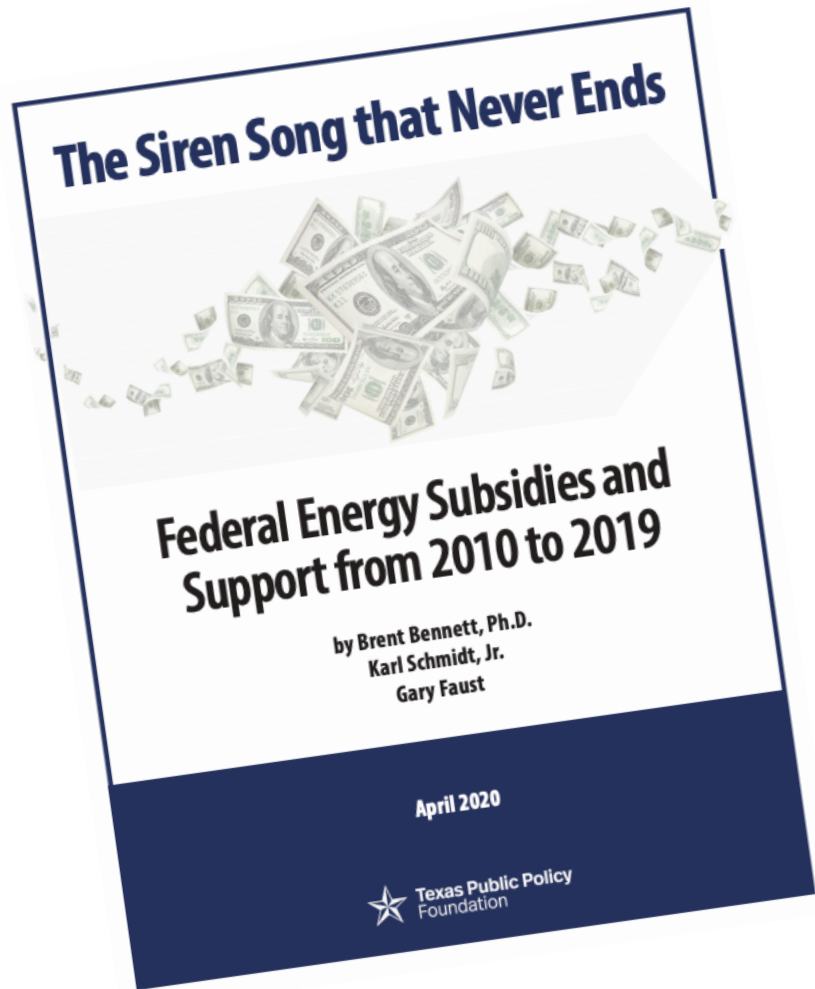

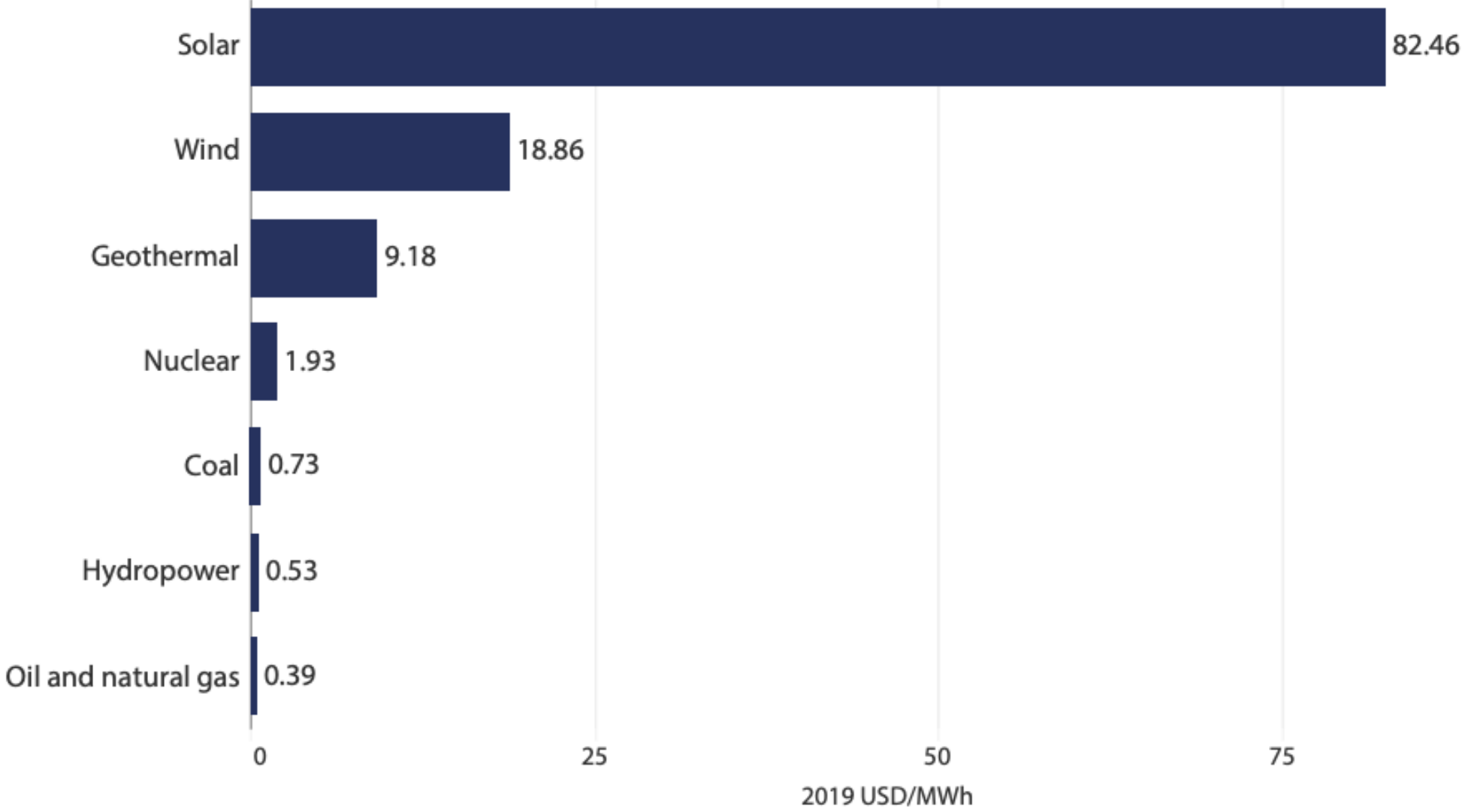

# The Dark Side of Energy Subsidies



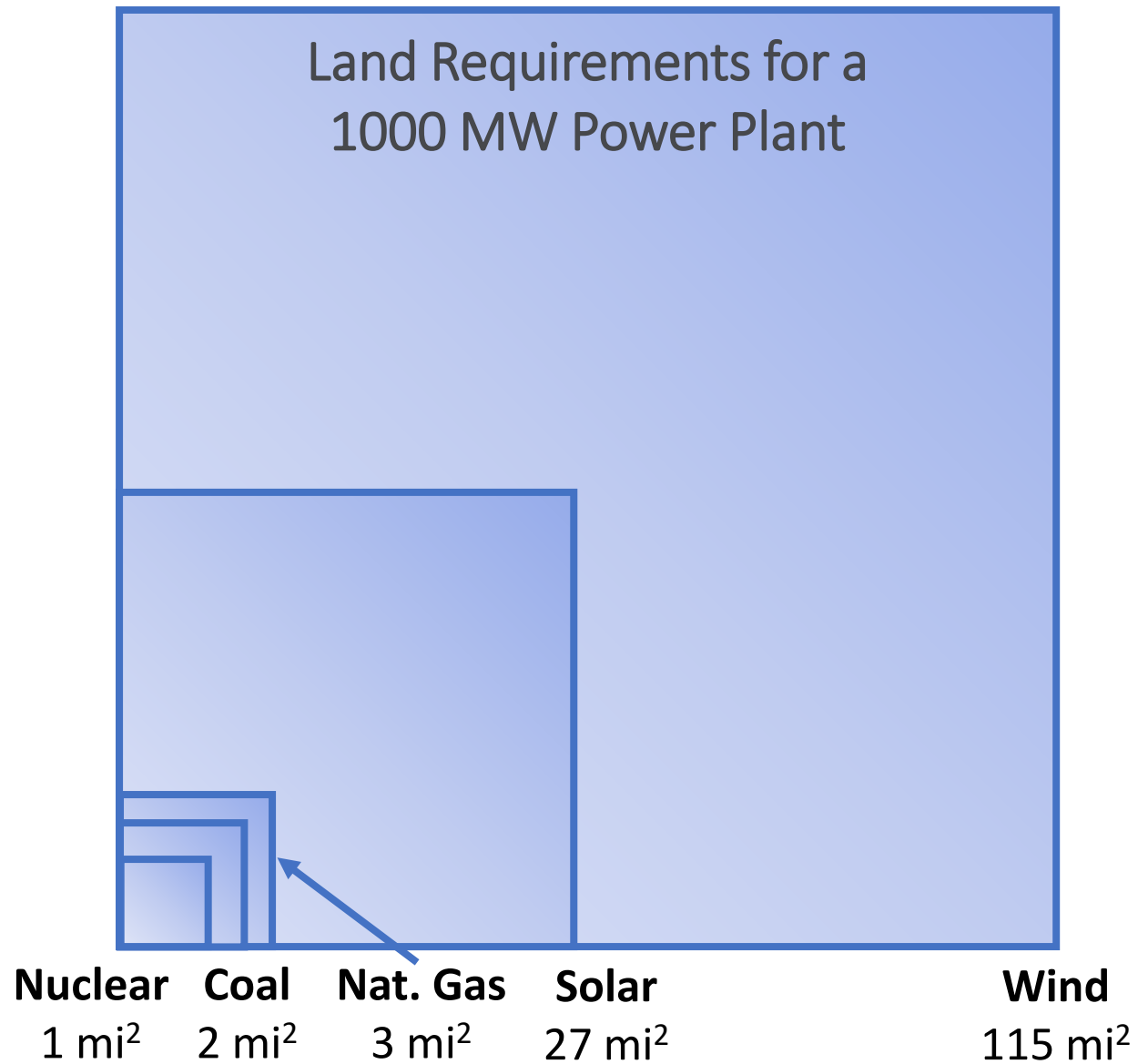
- **Over \$120 billion of our tax dollars** have been spent subsidizing energy in the last decade — with very limited results.
- Subsidies have not significantly advanced renewable energy technology as promised, creating a significant threat to grid reliability and draining the taxpayers' hard-earned dollars.

**Figure 5.** Federal subsidies per unit of electricity generated, 2010 to 2019 (2019 USD/MWh)

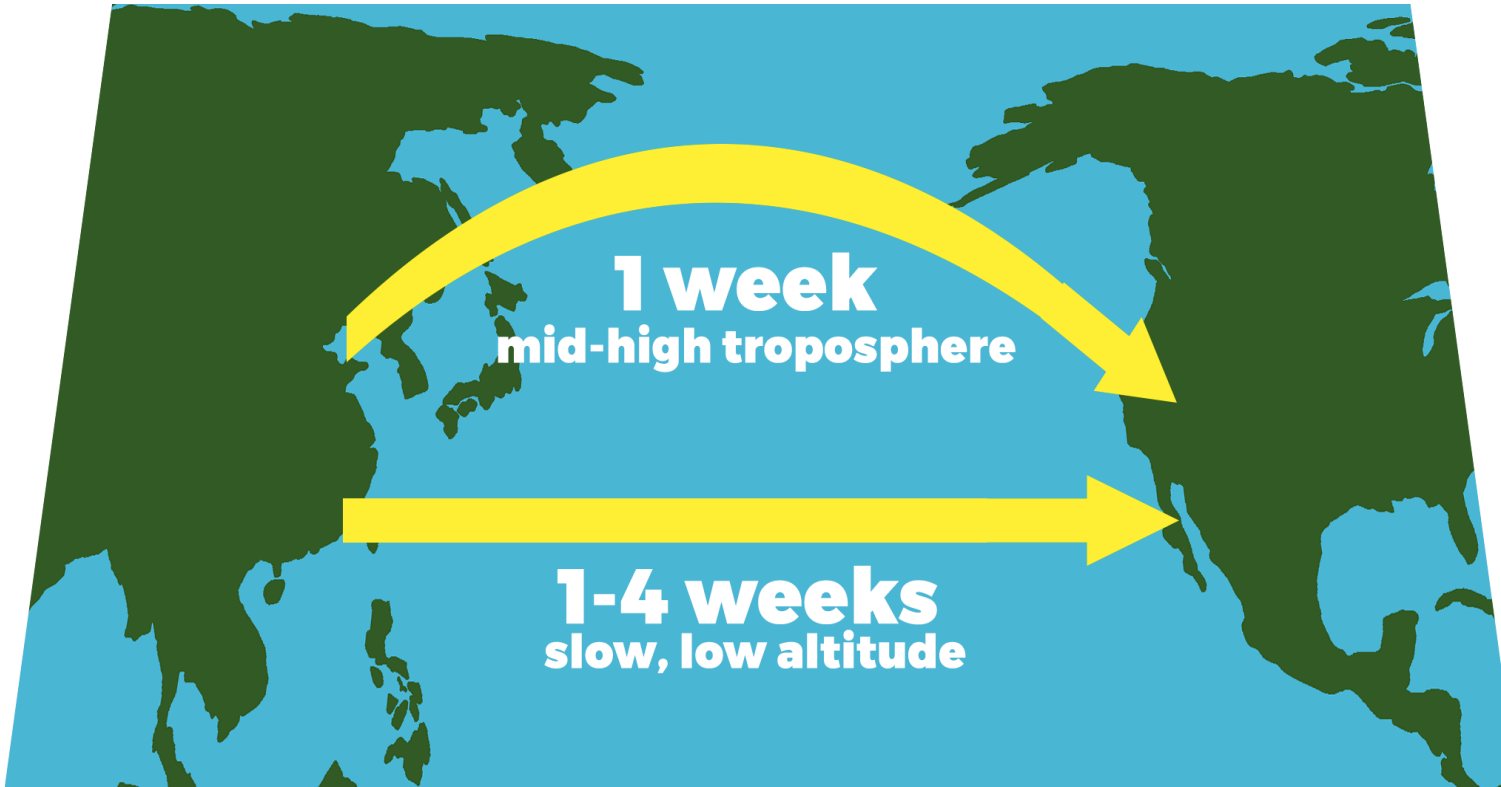




# Land Requirements for a 1000 MW Power Plant
