



### **Human Rights**

• Life, liberty, security, equality, education, and employment

#### **Cultural Identity**

• Cultural, spiritual, and linguistic identity

#### Self-Determination

• Internal governance and Indigenous institutions


### **Decision Making**

• Participation in decision making, treaties, agreements and arrangements and free, prior and informed consent

# Lands and Resources

• Access, ownership and development of lands, territories, and resources

### Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples Act (DRIPA)

#### • DRIPA requires:

- Alignment of BC's laws with the UN Declaration, and
- An action plan that includes consistent public reporting
- Requires regular reporting to the legislature to monitor progress (every March 31st)


#### DRIPA also:

- Allows for flexibility for the Province to enter into agreements with a broader range of Indigenous governments
- Creates a mechanism for decision making opportunities for Indigenous governments on matters that impact their citizens



# Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples Act: The Provincial Legislative Debate

- "The Act doesn't change existing tenures on Crown land, and nor does it, in and of itself, give the declaration legal force and effect.
- "In the short term we don't anticipate any significant changes in the regulatory framework. If there were changes coming, they would come in collaboration with Indigenous nations.
- "[What the Act means by 'laws'] does not apply to municipal bylaws and that sort of thing. OICs could apply, yes. Regulations could apply. The priorities and the pace of the work will be set in collaboration with Indigenous peoples"




