Any request for copies will be denied as required by law.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

I,, the undersigned, hereby acknowledge the
following rules and guidelines related to filing a complaint with the Council on Judicial Complaints (referred herein as "COJC" and "Council"):
1. The purpose of the COJC is to investigate written complaints alleging misconduct by a judge. The Council's sole concern is with the investigation of a judge's misconduct or behavior. The COJC has no authority to change a judge's decision and the COJC is not an appellate court. Appellate review and disqualification procedures exist and should be utilized to address concerns regarding unfavorable decisions or disqualification issues. In the absence of fraud, corrupt motive or bad faith on the judge's part, or unless a judge's decision constitutes such an abuse of discretion as to otherwise violate the Code of Judicial Conduct, an unfavorable decision from a judge does not constitute misconduct.
2. A judge is not required to disqualify or recuse from a case on the basis that a complaint has been filed with the COJC.
3. Upon receipt of your complaint, an investigation by the Council's staff will follow with a report ultimately presented to the Council detailing the results of the investigation. You will be notified by regular mail as soon as possible regarding the Council's decision. If the Council determines it is necessary, it may hold a confidential hearing at which you may be expected to testify under oath. You may also be required to testify under oath before the Court on the Judiciary about the facts set forth in your complaint.
4. The Council may dispose of your complaint by: (1) referring the matter to the appropriate entity for discipline or removal of the judge from office or (2) by dismissing the complaint. A complaint may be dismissed for various reasons including, but not limited to, the allegation concerns the judge's interpretation of law without any accompanying allegation of judicial misconduct, the alleged conduct is not judicial misconduct, lack of evidence sufficient to establish misconduct has occurred, or lack of jurisdiction for other reasons.
5. Oklahoma state law defines judicial misconduct to include, but not be limited to: (A) violation(s) of the Oklahoma Code of Judicial Conduct; (B) gross neglect of duty; (C) corruption in office; (D) habitual drunkenness; (E) commission of an offense involving moral turpitude; (F) gross partiality; (G) oppression; (H) mental or physical health disability which prevents the proper performance of a judge's duty; (I) acceptance of an unauthorized fee or gratuity for performing a required act; (J) continued willful noncompliance with the rules and directives of the Supreme Court, of the presiding judge of the administrative district, or of the chief judge of his district; and (K) participation in partisan political activities and participation in an election campaign other than for his/her own election to a judicial office.
6. This complaint form and any other documentation provided to the COJC will become the property/evidence of COJC and cannot be returned to you. Any request for copies of the file will be denied as required by law.
7. Details regarding the investigation into your complaint or any other disciplinary matters pending before the COJC are confidential pursuant to state statute and will not be shared with you.
8. Pursuant to Title 20, Section 1658 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the Council's investigation and all of its proceedings related to judicial complaints shall be held in secrecy to the same extent as proceedings before a grand jury.
