There is a location in the NW sector that has intermittently been out of service for over 3 weeks. Another station in the NE sector has bagged their dispensers but is still active for slow fill. John Melson is on the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Committee (OUBCC) which will resume meeting this month. The provers will be recalibrated over the next few months. This is an annual occurrence. They are working with the OnCue on 23rd to install a CNG/Hydrogen pod system. The permits are being worked on now.
